Double Duty

Evan Parks had more hits than he allowed in leading Forest Hills Eastern to its first MHSAA Baseball Title

Evan Parks wasn't nervous before or during the 2022 MHSAA Division 2 championship game at McLane Stadium.

Not while he took a no-hitter into the sixth inning, and not while going 3-for-3 with an RBI at the plate.

After his Ada Forest Hills Eastern team won its first baseball Finals title, defeating Grand Rapids Christian 3-0, it was a different story.

"It's starting to set in now," he said with a nervous laugh.

Parks held Grand Rapids Christian to one hit, an infield single by Nathan Hedlund, walked three and struck out nine.

"With him on the mound, him at the plate, him in the field, we always feel very, very comfortable," Hawks coach Ian Hearn said. "Our motto has been 'Team,' be servants for one another and serve one another."

Grand Rapids Christian pitcher Camden Seth had a good outing, scattering 10 hits while strong defense kept Forest Hills Eastern from causing any more damage.

"They're very talented," Hearn said. "They have a lot of very good baseball players, and coach (Brent) Gates does a really nice job. They kept us in check."

Parks drove in the only run the Hawks would need in the third inning. With two out, Caleb Kuiper singled and scored on a double by Parks off the fence in right field.

The Hawks added single runs in the fourth inning on a groundout by Max Ferrick, and in the fifth inning on a single by Leo Hearn.

"Hats off to them," Gates said. "Their pitcher did a great job on the mound. We battled. We competed. We just came up short."

The Hawks finished 39-4 after a 25-0 start.

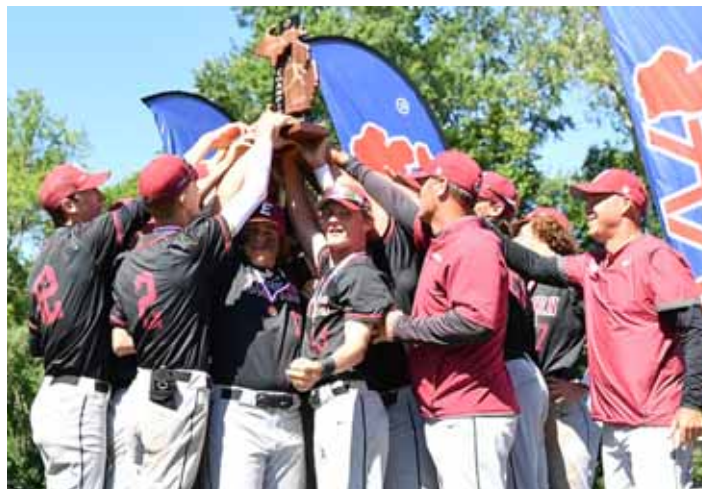
"We had amazing chemistry," Hearn said. "Right out of the gate, they competed well. We knew we were a pretty good team. I'm super proud of them and super proud of the way they handled themselves all season long."

Parks, for his part, stayed focused, admitting he didn't know he had no-hitter until the fifth inning.

"I just threw strikers," he said. "That's what it comes down to. That's how you get outs. We worked real hard all summer, all fall, all winter, even all spring and we finally got it done."

Forest Hills Eastern's work came to a close when Parks induced a game-ending double play.

"There is no way to describe it," Parks said of his reaction to the final out. "It means all the world when you see the ball down, your defense is playing for you. It means all the world when you see the play finally finish, and it's done."



Orchard Lake St. Mary's 1, Grosse Pointe North 0

Nearing the end of a season that saw Orchard Lake St. Mary's score more than 400 runs, it was a first-inning infield grounder that scored the only run the Eaglets would need to record their third-consecutive Division 1 baseball title, 1-0 over Grosse Pointe North.

The Eaglets (44-0) became the first team in MHSAA history to win that many games, and extended their second-best-in-state-history winning streak to 66.

None of it mattered to Grosse Pointe North lefty Brennan Hill, who gave up only three hits while walking one and striking out nine.

St. Mary's snuffed out rallies by North in the first and seventh innings by picking off runners in scoring position.

"I don't think anyone in the park thought that one run in the bottom of the first was going to be the difference," Eaglets coach Matt Petry said. "We executed, played good defense, and Ciaran (Caughey) and Jasen (Oliver) did a good job on the mound."

But the Eagles had to hold their breath in the seventh inning.

Brennan Hill singled and went to second on an infield out. After the second out, Parker O'Neill walked. Drew Hill then hit a hard smash down the first base line.

But first baseman **Blake Grimmer** (right) played the grounder perfectly, stepping on first base to end the threat and seal the championship for the Eaglets.

North first-year coach Kevin Shubnell, whose team finished 23-8, was emotional when asked how his team will be remembered.

"There's been a lot of change and turnover in this program the last couple of years," he said. "My one mission was to make this a positive experience for our six seniors. ... I'll never forget them."



Buchanan 3, Detroit Edison 1

Buchanan had no shortage of heroes in its 3-1 Division 3 championship game win over Detroit Edison.

Among them: Cade Preissing, who walked three times and scored all three runs for the Bucks; Matthew Hoover, who drove in two runs with a pair of doubles and also got the W on the mound, and pitcher Macoy West, who made a stratagem by Buchanan coach Jim Brawley pay off by relieving Hoover twice at crucial times to pick up the save.

"I'm very proud of these young men," Brawley said. "They've worked their butts off all year. They deserve it. They really do."

The championship was Buchanan's first since 1985. The Bucks most recently finished Division 3 runner-up in 2015.

They won this game with clutch hitting, scoring runs in the third and fifth innings with two outs. Both times, Preissing walked, then scored on doubles

by Hoover. Preissing scored an insurance run in the seventh inning. He led off with a walk, went to second base on a fielder's choice, to third on another fielder's choice, then scored on a single by West.

Edison, the first Detroit public school to play for a Finals title in baseball since Detroit Western in 1972, continuously answered to stay close. That's where Brawley's stratagem came in. Brawley opted to replace Hoover with West in the sixth inning to pitch to the lower third of the Pioneers' order. Hoover was back on the mound to start the seventh inning.

Edison got things going with a Terrell Crosson single, although he was a force out when Deshaun Williams reached on a fielder's choice. But two walks loaded the bases. In came West, again, who fell behind 3-1 to the only batter he faced - before coming back to get a strikeout and seal the win.

Riverview Gabriel Richard 4, Beal City 3

Riverview Gabriel Richard baseball coach Mike Magier admitted he was a little nervous while preparing to put in a freshman at a crucial point in the Division 4 championship game.

"You talk to him in the dugout, we're going back and forth and he doesn't seem fazed," Magier said, chuckling. "I don't know if he knows the situation or not. But he says, 'I'm ready Coach.' He throws a lot of strikes, and we had our best defense behind him when he's on the mound."

Drew Everingham entered in relief with a runner on and one out in the seventh. He hit his first batter, gave up an RBI single, then got a game-ending double play as GR edged Beal City, 4-3, for its second Finals title in five years. The Pioneers also won the Division 3 title in 2018.

The pitching victory went to senior Ashton Nowak, who started and went 6 1/3 innings before reaching the maximum pitch limit. He was in center field when the final outs were recorded.

The Pioneers (17-12) took a 1-0 lead in the third inning when **Brendan Hills** (right) doubled and scored on a single by Connor Silka. Richard added two more runs on a double to the left-center field gap off the bat of catcher Bryan Tuttle.

Beal City, which finished the season having averaged an MHSAA-record 12.5 runs per game, scored twice in the sixth inning on a bases-clearing triple by Jack Fussman to make the score 3-2. Richard added an insurance run in the top of the seventh on an RBI single by Nick Wisniewski.

The Aggies (30-3) had one more comeback try, trailing by two runs in the bottom of the seventh. Jake Gauthier walked to lead off the inning and eventually scored on a single by Brayden Haynes. But the rally fell short.

Diamond Protection

Millington didn't flinch in two straight walk-off wins to take the Division 3 crown

Dylan Holmes arrived at second base and crumbled to her knees as her teammate, Trinity Fessler, crossed the plate.

In a matter of an inning, the Millington senior's emotions went from devastation to jubilation.

Holmes delivered a walk-off double as the Cardinals defeated Evert 3-2 in eight innings in a thrilling Division 3 Final at Secchia Stadium.

It was the second straight walk-off victory for Millington, which defeated Algonac in the Semifinal one day earlier by scoring three runs in the bottom of the seventh inning.

"We've worked for this since we were 8 years old," Holmes said. "It's awesome to finally have it pay off. When I got to second base, I was just shook. It was over, and we did it. We won a state championship."

Holmes, a shortstop, made a crucial error with two outs in the top of the seventh inning that allowed Evert to score the game-tying run and send it to extra innings.

She quickly made amends with the big knock that gave Millington its second Division 3 title over the last four years.

"It was a great feeling to know that even though I did make those errors that my team was behind me cheering me on," Holmes said. "It was awesome to do that for my team, and I went up there knowing that I needed to get a base hit for my team and advance the runner."

Fessler, a senior, led off the inning with a single and scored from first base on Holmes' key hit.

"I was sending her no matter what, and I didn't care where the ball was," Cardinals coach Greg Hudie said. "Trinity is the fastest girl on the team, and it was a chance I was willing to take. I was going to make them make a great throw."

"Dylan had two costly errors, and I'm very grateful that

she was able to come through and help the team out in a positive way and win the game."

Senior Ashley Ziel picked up the win after striking out nine in eight innings of work.

"This just means everything," said Ziel, who also had two hits. "Two straight walkoffs on two separate days just shows the grit and determination of our team and how we pulled it together and got the win today."

Ziel was one of Holmes' biggest supporters.

"She had a tough go in the field, but I told her, 'You're going to get this right now,' and she did," Ziel said. "She hit that base hit and saved the day."

Millington won despite committing an uncharacteristic five errors.

"Obviously, not our best game," Hudie said. "I don't think we had a game this year where we had three or more errors, so we didn't play clean ball. But we played together and finished it out somehow."

Millington struck first in the bottom of the third inning when Kendall Payne scored on a sacrifice fly from Lilia Sherman.

Evert tied it in the fifth inning on a sacrifice fly and throwing error that scored Brooklyn Decker, who walked to open the inning.

Fessler singled to open the sixth inning and then scored the go-ahead run on a double by senior Emma Dickie.

Evert rallied to tie it in a wild top of the seventh inning.

"They just worked their tails off and persevered," said Wildcats coach Amanda Brown, whose team was searching for its first Finals title. "We were down, then we were tied and it was amazing. They kept their grit, and they did a great job. I'm really proud of them, and it was a fun game to watch. It was competitive, and that's all you can ask for."

Allen Park 5, Macomb Dakota 0

Allen Park senior **Madilyn Ramey** (coming home, right) remembered the walk to the Old College Field awards area in 2021 following a disappointing loss in the Division 1 Softball Final to South Lyon.

Ramey and her teammates took the same path in 2022. But this time, they enjoyed a much different emotion. Second-ranked Allen Park won the program's first Division 1 Final after blanking Macomb Dakota 5-0.

"Last year, that same walk we just had was a different type of feeling," said Ramey, who had a home run and a pair of outstanding defensive plays. "Now that we came back here, we rewrote the story and it just feels amazing."

In the third inning, Allen Park (38-4-1) snared the early momentum. After a leadoff single by senior Madison Hool and a sacrifice bunt, freshman Kiley Carr tripled over the right fielder's head to give the Jaguars a 1-0 lead.

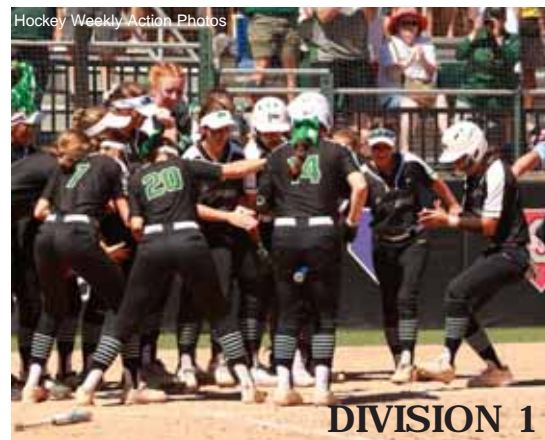
Carr would score to make it 2-0 after a Dakota fielding error off the bat of Makalya Sitarski.

A squeeze bunt by Avery Garden sent Sitarski home, and it was 3-0.

In the sixth inning, senior Madilyn Ramey slugged a solo home run and the lead expanded to 4-0.

Allen Park tacked on one more in the top of the seventh inning. Another sacrifice bunt from Garden scored Faith Peschke, who led off the inning with a walk.

Third-ranked Dakota (32-5), which won the Division 1 title in 2017, outhit the Jaguars 5-4, but couldn't get any timely ones off Allen Park senior pitcher Morgan Sizemore and against a stellar defense.



Stevensville Lakeshore 6, Trenton 2

The Stevensville Lakeshore softball team had become accustomed to playing in close games.

The 2022 Division 2 Final provided another tightly-contested matchup until the Lancers pulled away in the late innings.

The Lancers (40-4) rallied to defeat Trenton 6-2 to win the program's eighth Finals championship and first since 2014.

Lakeshore's previous three games all were decided by one run, and this one wasn't decided until the Lancers scored six runs over the final three innings to erase a 2-0 deficit.

"We tried to instill in the team that pressure wasn't a hardship, it was an honor," said Lancers senior Anna Chellman, who had two hits and two RBI.

Trenton (33-11) was in a Final for the first time since 2005 and seeking its first championship.

The Trojans grabbed the early lead with RBI singles from Annika Segedi and Aleah Tanguay in the third and fourth innings, respectively.

The Lancers, however, mounted a comeback in the top of the fifth.

A single from Gabby Solloway and an error scored two to knot the score at 2-2. Solloway advanced to third on the error and then scored the go-ahead run on a ground out.

Lakeshore extended its lead in the sixth inning thanks to a leadoff double by Pallas Dominion, who scored on a fielder's choice.

The Lancers added a pair of insurance runs in the top of the seventh. A double by Chellman that glanced off the glove of the left fielder scored Kerschbaum, and a sacrifice fly from Eden Gray brought home Solloway.



Unionville-Sebewaing 4, Ottawa Lake Whiteford 1

Macy Reinhardt made the most of her final at-bat in a Unionville-Sebewaing uniform. The senior standout helped create breathing room late in the Division 4 Final en route to her team's 4-1 win over Ottawa Lake Whiteford.

Reinhardt launched a shot to the top of the wall on a 3-2 pitch in the sixth inning to drive in a pair of runs and extend the Patriots' advantage.

"I knew it was probably going to be the last at-bat of my career, so I put a lot of heart and soul into it," Reinhardt said. "Honestly, this never gets old and it's special to win another one to end my high school career."

The Patriots continued their dominance in Division 4 and won their fifth Finals championship over the last seven years. The title also was their third in a row.

After three scoreless innings, the Patriots capitalized on a two-out throwing error by the Bobcats in the fourth inning. USA scored twice on the play. The narrow margin remained that way until Reinhardt's clutch hit doubled the lead.

Senior pitcher Laci Harris pitched well for the second-straight day. She struck out nine and didn't walk a batter.

"This means a lot to me because the seniors are leaving history at our school by winning three in a row," Harris said. "I wanted to win this last one as a senior, and Macy helped me a lot today."

The Bobcats answered in the bottom of the sixth inning. Junior Patrina Marsh doubled and sophomore Unity Nelson singled her in to trim the deficit to 4-1. Whiteford had the game-tying run at the plate in its last at-bat, but Harris got a flyout to left to end the game.

The Bobcats were hoping to win their first Finals championship since 1987, but couldn't break through despite out-hitting the Patriots 9-5.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2023

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 34 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2022-23 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2023-24 school year. This year, a total of 1,440 applications from 421 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients were honored during the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2023-24 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2023-24 are: **Cale Bell**, Sault Ste. Marie; **Drew Cady**, Oxford; **Macy Jenkins**, Milford; **Isaiah Kabban**, Harbor Beach; **Ella Knudsen**, Leland; **Kaylee Kranz**, Clinton; **Joey Spada**, Kalamazoo Central; and **Aynalem Zoet**, Grandville Calvin Christian.

Those eight new members were selected from 105 applicants. That number of applicants was the fourth-most ever, with the last four years featuring the four highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 137 schools from 50 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 16 MHSAA sports, and all eight will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
