## Four Years In A Row! <br> Athletic Participation Sets Records At MHSAA Schools Again

EAST LANSING, Mich. - June 3 - Participation in high school sports took place in record numbers at Michigan High School Athletic Association member schools across the state for the fourth straight year in 2002-03.

There was a total of 294,012 participants in sports in which the Association sponsors post-season tourna ments during the past school year, topping last year's mark of 287,795. Among the student-athletes, a record 124,393 girls participants took part, up from 119,195 last year and the 2000-01 record of 119,586; and boys participation also hit a new high of 169,619 , up from the old record of 168,600 last year. The totals count students once for each sport in which he or she participates, meaning students who are multiple -sport athletes are counted more than once. The participation figures in MHSAA tournament sports for girls are up 19 percent since the 1994-95 school year. Boys are up nine percent over the same time period.

Volleyball continues to be the most popular sport for girls, with 21,678 participants in 2002-03, the 200001 record of 21,572. Girls sports hitting their all-time highs in participation last year were basketball, competitive cheer, golf, soccer, softball, and tennis.

The most popular boys sport continues to be football, with last year's 44,480 participants an all-time high for the third straight year. Other boys sports hitting new participation highs last year were ice hockey, soccer, and tennis.

The participation figures are gathered annually from MHSAA member schools to submit to the National Federation of State High School Associations for compiling its national participation survey. The results of the survey from the 2000-01 school year on may be viewed on the NFHS Web Site - www.nfhs.org. Nationwide results for 2002-03 will be available later this summer.

The following chart shows participation figures for the 2002-03 school year from MHSAA member schools in sports in which the Association sponsors a post-season tournament:

The MHSAA is a private, not-for-profit corporation of voluntary membership by over 1,200 public and private senior high schools and junior high/middle schools which exists to develop common rules for athletic eligibility and competition. No government funds or tax dollars support the MHSAA, which was the first such association nationally to not accept membership dues or tournament entry fees from schools. Member schools which enforce these rules are permitted to participate in MHSAA tournaments, which attract approximately 1.6 million spectators each year.

CORRECTION FROM LAST YEAR'S RELEASE - In last June's press release announcing athletic participation at MHSAA member schools, the numbers used were total participation figures, which were all records for total participation, but which included sports in which the MHSAA does not sponsor post-season tournaments. Here are the numbers used compared to the actual numbers from participation in MHSAA tournament sports and how they rank:

- Overall Participation - 301,544 was the number used; 287,795 was the actual - still a record at that time for MHSAA tournament sports
- Girls Participation - 127,178 was the number used; 119,195 was the actual - second all-time at that time for MHSAA tournament sports
- Boys Participation - 174,366 was the number used; 168,600 was the actual - still a record at that time for MHSAA tournament sports
