# DO'S & DON'TS FOR PARENTS OF STUDENT-ATHLETES: PART 1 For use between 8/26/02 and 12/7/02 (60 Second Spot)

Here's another installment of do's and don'ts for parents of student-athletes: Point Number One: Avoid the Post-Game Analysis with your youngster. When taking them home or greeting them after they get off the bus following a game, don't go through an analysis of what they did well, or not so well, that day. From the parent's perspective, telling your youngster to adjust their stance, to do a better job looking for a open player or to hustle more on defense may seem like valid points to discuss. But the Post-Game Analysis can quickly ruin the fun your child just had. Besides, the job of analyzing the game belongs to the coach. Mom and Dad...give your youngster a break. Save your constructive criticism for later in a two-way conversation about the game – or better yet, don't bring it up at all. After the game, you need to be positive and brief. # DO'S & DON'TS FOR PARENTS OF STUDENT-ATHLETES: PART 2 For use between 8/26/02 and 12/7/02 (60 Second Spot)

Here's another installment of do's and don'ts for parents of student-athletes: Point Number Two: Be realistic about their abilities and their chances for an athletic scholarship to college. Parents, you need to tune into these statistics rather than tune them out: Less than one percent of high school student-athletes will receive a Division One scholarship. Less than three percent of high school student-athletes will go on to play college athletics at all, and most of those will receive little, if any, financial aid based on athletic ability. The fact of the matter is that for every dollar of athletic financial aid to college, there's 38 dollars of academic aid. Every parent wants to boast that their kid got a "full ride" to college based on sports, but that's rarely the truth. Make sure your student-athlete is cutting it academically as well as athletically, and look for all of the opportunities for financial aid that are available – you'd be surprised at what you can get. The balanced person is what our colleges want, and what our communities need for the future.
