New Coaches In-Service Scheduled For Oct. 25 In Frankenmuth

EAST LANSING, Mich. – **Oct. 1** – The featured speakers for the Michigan High School Athletic Association's New Coaches In-Service, Oct. 25 in Frankenmuth, will include presentations on the philosophical and legal aspects of high school sports.

The third annual one-day seminar will take place at Frankenmuth High School, from 8:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. The workshop has been moved into the body of the school year from the summer in an attempt to increase attendance. The cost of the program is \$20, and includes lunch and materials.
