### **Discussion Items**

# **Basketball Seeding Discussion**

The committee was advised that there is currently no movement on discussions involving basketball seeding. There appears to be little interest or no consensus on method or level to seed.

#### **Golf Discussion**

The committee discussed at length the proposals and recommendations to divide all UP Golf schools into three equal divisions. There is still concern in those divisions where different sites are used for boys and girls for equitable coaching and supervision when the school has the same coach for both genders. Also, there is concern for the exasperating effort to find multiple sites for both genders and tournament competition between the largest school in a division and the smallest school in the same division.

The committee asked that more data be provided at its September meeting where more discussion will occur.

# **Football Discussion**

This discussion centered on the dynamics of scheduling. Noting more teams are moving to the 8-Player format, leaving more schools to find 11-Player opponents. No recommendations.

# **Softball Discussion**

The committee discussed the growing number of softball teams in Division 3 which is forcing the one UP District to be comprised of 9 teams. A nine team district requires more games and a difficult schedule for the host manager and competing teams. The committee, with understanding in the growth of softball, asks MHSAA staff to consider other tournament design that will eliminate 7 team or larger districts.
