Non-Traditional Draw – The committee voted to require Districts 93c, 96c, 126d and 127d to be conducted in the Non-Traditional Draw Format.

8-Player Football Discussion

The committee discussed at length the new and developing protocols for two divisions of 8-Player football. The committee reviewed five points that will be discussed by the Representative Council at its May meeting. While not every point achieved unanimous thought, there was however, general consensus on the following points.

1. How should teams qualify? It is thought that the selection method used currently should be maintained. The top 16 teams in each division with the highest play off average should qualify for tournament participation.

- 2. When should divisions be determined? Several committee members suggested that the divisions should be determined on "Football Sunday", like the 11-player format; while others suggested that the divisions should be determined in March.
- 3. Where should the championship games be played? Given that there is loyalty to NMU and an indoor facility, the general consensus is for flexible schedule/format that would accommodate finals nearest the competing teams on either Friday or Saturday while possibly combining and 11-Player Semifinal with an 8-Player Final.
- 4. Should the maximum enrollment for the 8-Player tournament be a fixed number or a moving target? There was no consensus for a moving target enrollment. But, support for a static number representing the Class D enrollment maximum.
- 5. Should there be a grace period? The committee was united in that there should be a grace period for those schools that have met the enrollment standard but go beyond that standard in a subsequent year. The committee suggested at most, the grace period should not exceed two consecutive years.

Presentations

Mr. Gustafson and Mr. Unger presented committee appreciation plaques to outgoing committee members Mr. Gary Brayak, Rock-Mid Pen and Mr. Chris Hartman, Iron Mountain.

Mr. Brayak has been instrumental in arranging for and hosting the Division three Upper Peninsula Golf Finals. His service to the Upper Peninsula schools and committee will be missed.

Mr. Hartman, has been a valued committee member and servant to the Upper Peninsula schools as host manager to many tournaments and sharing his expertise as a basketball official as well as assisting the committee and the MHSAA with official assignments and replacements. He too will be missed.
