Ab-solutely!

Abby VanderKooi became part of an exclusive club at the 2021 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals with her fourth championship.

Abby VanderKooi had made it look easy for three years, dominating her divisions at the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals as one of the top runners in the nation. But the 2021 season was anything but easy for VanderKooi, and neither was the race in which the Muskegon Western Michigan Christian senior won her fourth MHSAA championship.

VanderKooi joined a select group of four-time champions by running a time of 18:06.58 at the Division 4 race at Michigan International Speedway. As she crossed the finish line, completing her four-year mission, VanderKooi staggered a bit before gathering herself.

"That hurt," she said. "I was happy to be done. I saw the flag and I was like, 'Oh, the gates of heaven!'"

VanderKooi won the MHSAA LP Division 4 title in 2018 and 2019 and the Division 3 crown when her school moved up a division for one year in 2020. She became only the fourth girl to win four outright MHSAA Lower Peninsula individual championships.

The others are Carrie Gould of Burton Bendle and Flint Powers Catholic (1992-95), Katie Boyles of Rochester Adams (1997-2000) and Kirsten Olling of Breckenridge (2010-13).

"It's really special," VanderKooi said. "Not many people get to do that. I'm so thankful I have the ability to do that."

VanderKooi said she had trouble breathing in the cold air in the first race of the day at MIS. It was just one of several challenges she faced last year.

"I haven't been having a good season; I don't know why," she said. "I haven't been able to click into it. Ever since I broke my toe in track season, I haven't been able to get back into running fast times, so that's been really frustrating."

Unlike her past three MHSAA Finals, VanderKooi had company after the initial burst from the start line. She reached the mile mark in 5:47.9, with Buckley sophomore Aiden Harrand close behind at 5:49.5. The gap increased to nine seconds at the two-mile mark.

"I could hear her the whole time," VanderKooi said. "When you hear people cheering for other people behind you, it's kind of scary."

For VanderKooi, her performance wasn't all about individual glory. Her first-place helped Western Michigan Christian win its first MHSAA team championship by an 81-108 margin over Kalamazoo Christian.

Her freshman sister, Grace, took eighth in 19:28.28. Completing the team score were Ava Rotman (33rd, 20:41.09), Brianna Zuidema (36th, 20:43.09) and Eleanor Kingshott (59th, 21:12.33).

"Having my team along, especially my sister, it means the world to me," Abby VanderKooi said. "I've never had so much fun with such a wonderful team."



Sister Act Leads to Pioneer Sweep

If there is an expectation to maintain a family legacy, Rachel Forsyth doesn't feel it at home.

The Forsyth parents, Ian and Jessica, were standout runners for the University of Michigan.

"My dad makes it very known there's no pressure put on any of us, but it does feel really good to follow in my sisters' footsteps," Forsyth said.

Forsyth is carving out her own legacy at Pioneer, becoming the first of three talented sisters to win an MHSAA Cross Country championship after crossing the 2021 Lower Peninsula Division 1 finish line first in 17:09.32.

Her time was the fastest by a sophomore girl in 26 MHSAA Finals at MIS.

Sister Sarah Forsyth, a senior, placed eighth in 18:02.86. The sisters led Pioneer to a third straight Division 1 team championship by a 68-100 margin over Holland West Ottawa.

Their older sister, Anne, was the 2016 Division 1 runner-up.



Rounding out Pioneer's effort were senior Cookie Baugh, 12th in 18:16.55; junior Emily Cooper, 35th in 18:44.39, and sophomore Natalie Mello 45th in 18:54.67.

"My teammates are really fast," said Rachel, who finished second in 2020. "They definitely push me in workouts. We all work together. I love all of them, so it's a nice atmosphere."

Forsyth ran fearlessly, going to the lead right away to provide a target for some strong runners. Forsyth reached the mile mark in 5:27.9, with Arianne Olson of Holland West Ottawa (5:28.1) and Julia Flynn of Traverse City Central (5:29.6) the only runners within 10 seconds.

By the two-mile mark, which Forsyth hit in 11:00.3, she had an 8.6-second lead over Olson and a 12.1-second cushion over Flynn.

Flynn finished second in 17:20.49, while Olson was third in 17:36.81. The top seven runners broke 18 minutes.

Division 1 Boys

Riley Hough (right) of Hartland is flattered whenever his name is mentioned in the same breath as Dathan Ritzenhein's.

Few runners who have come along in the last 21 years inspired any comparisons to the former Rockford great.

Hough did something the three-time Olympian never accomplished at MIS by breaking 15 minutes for the second time.

Hough's time of 14:56.47 came one year after he won in 14:49.62.

Winning the team championship for the second time in three years was Brighton, which outscored runner-up Caledonia, 141-175.

The Bulldogs had five different scoring runners from their 2019 team, with only one runner back from the seven who took the course two years ago.

Senior Quinn Cullen ran a personal-best 15:37.54 to lead Brighton, placing sixth individually.

**Division 2 Boys**

When Caleb Jarema crossed the finish line at MIS in 2020, a bull's eye was painted on his back. Having placed second in the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 2 cross country race behind Fremont senior Nathan Walker, Jarema automatically became the man to beat in 2021.

Jarema fulfilled the promise he showed at MIS as a junior, winning the 2021 Division 2 race with a time of 15:22.22.

Team-wise, after five top-five finishes in Division 2 over the last six seasons, Otsego won its first MHSAA championship by a 135-147 score over Chelsea.

Senior Nick Cockerel was ninth in 15:53.86, senior Tristin Canales was 15th in 15:59.58, senior Mason Kolhoff was 17th in 16:01.35, senior Chase Brown was 36th in 16:29.17 and junior Colin Wesseldyk was 95th in 17:05.04 for Otsego.

Division 2 Girls

The clock was ticking on Madelyn Frens' hopes of winning an MHSAA cross country championship in her final season at Grand Rapids Christian.

After running a blistering time of 17:56.0 on Aug. 28 at the Pete Moss Invitational at Benzie Central, Frens was sidelined with a stress reaction in her right femur.

But after going nearly four weeks without a race, Frens returned without missing a beat. With five races as a build-up for the 2021 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 2 Final, Frens pulled away from a five-way battle for the championship to win in 17:52.30.

Her team finished second with 99 points behind East Grand Rapids, which had 66.

It was the third MHSAA team championship in four years for East Grand Rapids, which took second in 2020.

East Grand Rapids put four runners in the top 15, with sophomore Drew Muller placing fifth in 18:23.28, senior Ainsley Workman ninth in 18:55.57, freshman Sadey Seyferth 12th in 18:58.41, sophomore Sophia Lado 15th in 19:05.87 and junior Abigail Petr 52nd in 19:50.93.

Division 3 Boys

Hunter Jones wasn't running against his peers on the 2021 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 3 cross country scene, because he's actually without peer at that level.

The Benzie Central junior is actually in pursuit of a legend from the past.

Jones is one victory away from becoming the first boy to win four outright MHSAA individual championships after another dominant performance at MIS.

Jones crossed the line in 15:08.39, the third-fastest time in Division 3 history.

The only boys to win four races at an MHSAA final meet is the late Ryan Shay of Central Lake. Shay won his races every year from 1993-96, but his time in the 1993 individual race wasn't the fastest in Class D that day back when there were separate races for individual and team qualifiers.

St. Louis repeated as the Division 3 team champion, scoring 104 points to outscore runner-up Hart by 42.

Senior Nate March was eighth in 16:17.70, sophomore Ben March was ninth in 16:19.23, senior Aaron Bowerman was 24th in 16:40.99, junior Dylan Marr was 43rd in 17:13.15 and freshman Landon Pestrue was 63rd in 17:21.89 for St. Louis.

Division 3 Girls

In 2020, Lani Bloom of Ithaca was in first place with a decisive lead, less than 100 meters from the finish line at MIS.

But then she fell and was reduced to a slow crawl.

As she desperately tried to reach the line on her hands and knees, three runners passed her. It was the second year in a row that Bloom led coming down the stretch at MIS, only to stall. She was 18th in 2019 after leading with 800 yards remaining, collapsing after crossing the line.

So, that fist pump she gave when she crossed the line at MIS last fall was almost as much for the fact she finished upright as it was for winning the Division 3 individual title.

She cruised through the finish in 17:29.69, 30 seconds ahead of Hart sophomore Alyson Enns.

Enns and her teammates, meanwhile, celebrated their fifth team championship in a row to tie an MHSAA girls record (Rockford Class A/Division 1, 1998-2002).

Following Bloom across the line were three Hart runners who took places two through four. Alyson Enns was second in 17:59.67, Jazwinski was third in 18:00.59 and senior Audrianna Enns was fourth in 18:32.27.

Division 4 Boys

Lezawe Osterink's (right) arrival among the MHSAA's elite was deferred for a year.

He was ready to make a run at the Lower Peninsula Division 4 cross country championship in 2020, but was unable to run at Regionals after breaking his collarbone on a training run.

The junior from Wyoming Potter's House showed up at MIS last fall as a different runner than the one who had a respectable 55th place as a freshman in 2019.

Osterink completed an undefeated season by winning the Division 4 race in 15:50.60. He won by 23.76 seconds ahead of Concord senior Jonathan Mikovits.

Osterink won all 13 races in which he competed.

In the team competition, Hillsdale Academy grouped its second through fifth runners only 13 seconds apart to win with a score of 154 points.

Senior Emil Schlueter gave Hillsdale Academy a low stick with his eighth-place finish in 16:49.75, good for sixth among team runners. Two 8th-graders scored for the Colts: Cole Bates (64th, 17:56.70) and Grayson Rorick (72nd, 18:02.22). Also scoring were sophomore Thomas Holm (51st, 17:49.17) and freshman Vincent Reagle (69th, 17:59.71).

Michigan International Speedway

Michigan International Speedway is the site for the 2022 Michigan High School Athletic Association Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals — the 27th time the Finals for all classes, both boys and girls, will be held on the same course on the same day.

Michigan International Speedway opened in 1968. Over 2.5 million tons of earth was moved to construct the two-mile oval and two, 1.9-mile road courses. The road courses wind through the infield and behind the backstretch, parts of which form the route the runners will follow today. Runners could see a variety of wildlife while winding through the hilly terrain behind the backstretch, including many deer which live on the property. MIS is home to one of Michigan's largest paid-admission sporting events each year. Fans also enjoy NASCAR and ARCA Menard Series events during race weekends in June and August.

Michigan International Speedway has provided the use of this unique, 1,400-acre facility, as well as many of its services to the MHSAA for this meet at a discounted rate. The MHSAA hopes you enjoy your visit to the beautiful Irish Hills.

Spectator Viewing

Spectators may view today's races from the main grandstands, on pit road or from designated course locations. To access the infield/pit road area use the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel located south of the main grandstands in turn 1. Please note that access to the finish area, garage area and infield suites are restricted to the athletes, coaches and officials.

Handicap Sections

Handicapped/wheelchair access is located in the main grandstands. Handicapped/wheelchair access is also available in Victory Lane near the finish area. Paved handicap parking is available in Lot 11, which is located across the street from the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel entrance.

First Aid

Medical assistance is available through Jackson Community Ambulance services.

Restrooms

Public facilities are available under the main grandstands. Facilities are also available on the infield.

Lost & Found

Please take any recovered articles to the packet pick up/results room.

Concessions & Finals Merchandise

Refreshments and food can be purchased in the concession area behind the south end of the main grandstands and in two locations near the infield awards area. Souvenir t-shirts, sweatshirts, souvenir programs and photographs will be sold at infield locations near the start line and awards area.

Spectator Videotaping & Still Photography

Spectator videotaping and still photography are allowed at the Cross Country Finals with the understanding that the tape or images are for personal use only and not to be sold, leased, borrowed, rented or duplicated for commercial purposes or shown on television or the Internet. Videotaping and still photography must be done in a manner that does not obstruct the view of other spectators.

Participating schools are responsible for informing their students, parents and other fans of this policy and to assist the MHSAA upon request in enforcing it. Participating schools are asked to help promote where their particular game may be viewed when being streamed by the MHSAA, one of its television partners, or a media outlet, which has pre-arranged to secure such rights.

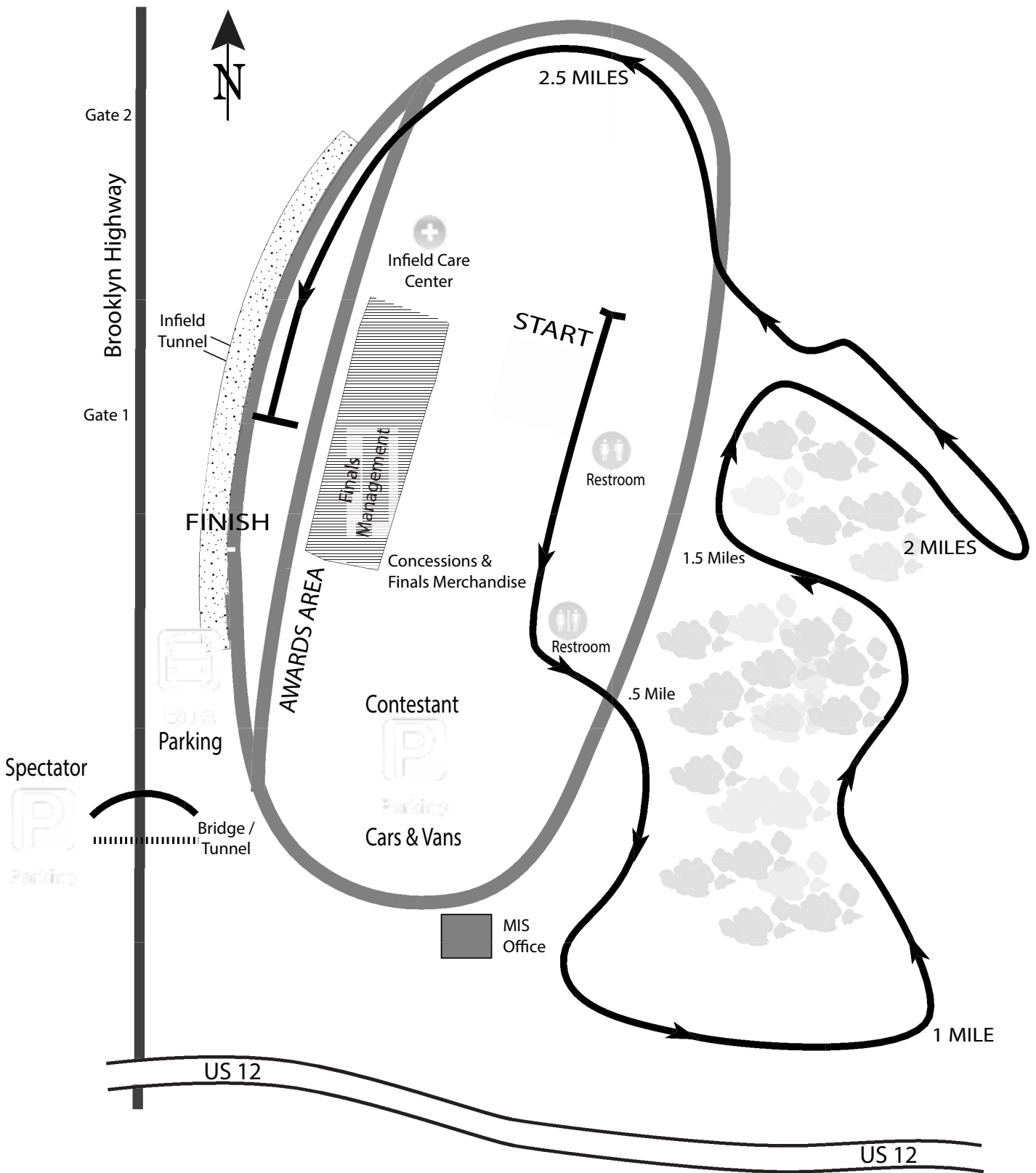

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2022-23 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2022-23 are: **Kannon Duffing**, Manchester; **Claire Gorno**, Gaylord; **M'Khi Guy**, Muskegon; **Dawson Lehw**, Marcellus; **Christian Sanders**, Detroit Renaissance; **Ben Sytsma**, Grand Rapids Christian; **Madeline Werner**, Bay City All Saints; and **DaNia Womack**, Dearborn Advanced Tech Academy.

Those eight new members were selected from 115 applicants. That applicant total was the second-most ever, with the last three years featuring the three highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 129 schools from 48 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic

Sportsmanship Extends to Online Behavior

With the changes that have occurred in college sports the past couple of years, high school sports is truly the last level of pure amateur competition in our country – and the NFHS and its member state associations want it to remain that way.

As football, volleyball, soccer, cross country and other sports begin this fall, high school coaches and athletic/activity directors will be involved in preseason meetings to emphasize the expected outcomes of education-based sports, as well as speech, debate, music, theatre and other programs.

Among those fundamental values of education-based activities that must be discussed is sportsmanship, or good sporting behavior. More than winning, more than learning the skills of a sport, a focus on sportsmanship has been one of the defining elements of high school sports and other activities for more than 100 years.

Along with maintaining the sound traditions of sports and minimizing the risk of injury, NFHS playing rules encourage sportsmanship, and the first page in all NFHS rules publications includes a statement noting that “each athlete is responsible for exercising caution and good sportsmanship.”

In the past, with an emphasis on conduct on the playing field or court – or in the auditorium or rehearsal hall – sportsmanship has been defined as those qualities of behavior that are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. More so than preparing students to play sports or another activity at the next level, one of the significant goals of education-based high school sports and activities is helping the 12 million-plus individuals in these programs to become responsible citizens.

And in today’s online world dominated by hand-held devices, that goal has become more challenging. Now, messages to students in high school sports and other activities about sportsmanship must be communicated before they hit the practice field or court because one inappropriate post, tweet or message could alter their lives forever.

At the recent virtual National Student Leadership Summit hosted by the NFHS, Christina Jontra of Neptune Navigate, one of the newest NFHS corporate partners, discussed the need for good sportsmanship online as much or more so than on the court or field.

In the digital age in which we live, participants in high school activity programs need to be aware that

their character and respect for others should be the same, whether in the sport or activity itself, or online.

As the popularity and influence of social media continues to surge, it is imperative that student-athletes, as well as coaches, administrators, parents and everyone involved in education-based athletics, are aware of the ways they can endanger themselves with their online behavior and understand the techniques they can employ to prevent that from happening.

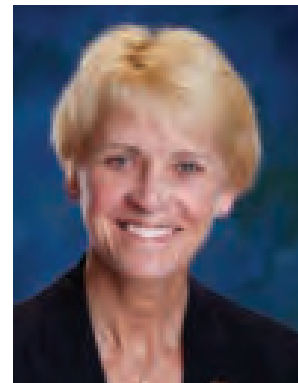
In her recent presentation, Jontra noted five characteristics of good sportsmanship online – honesty, compassion, respect, responsibility and courage. Just as a student would respect an opponent on the field or in the debate room, the same must occur online.

At preseason meetings this fall, coaches and athletic/activity directors should encourage students in their programs to be mindful of online contact with individuals on opposing teams – particularly any bantering that could be perceived as cyberbullying. As Jontra mentioned in her message during the NSLS, hurtful words can ruin a person’s life forever.

Fortunately, during the season, the millions of high school students involved in sports and performing arts have less free time to spend online on a daily basis, but the time spent must be done in a positive manner. Not only could damaging words on social media affect a student’s chances for an athletic scholarship, inappropriate messages could also negatively impact future job possibilities as employers are more actively auditing social media.

Whether the setting is before hundreds of people at an actual game or event, or a private experience alone online, positive and respectful behavior should be the choice every time.

Scholar-Athlete Award in 34th Year Awarding Scholarships to Students

Thousands of students voluntarily extend their classroom day by taking part in extracurricular activities, often improving their academic achievements in the process. The value that such programs play in the total education of a high school student is highlighted through the MHSAA/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award, which will award \$2,000 scholarships to 32 top student-athletes and recognize over 2,000 other outstanding individuals in 2022-23.

Underwritten by Farm Bureau Insurance, the Scholar-Athlete Award is now in its 34th year, and presents scholarships to students in every MHSAA enrollment classification. The scholarships may be used at any institution of higher learning.

“It is amazing to see the number of young people who are proven achievers in academics and activities,” said Mark Uyl, executive director of the MHSAA. “At a time when our educational system is coming under fire, the Scholar-Athlete

Award is something that proves how important athletics are to the development of a well-rounded person.”

Students applying for the Scholar-Athlete Award must be graduating during the 2022-23 school year, carry a 3.5 grade-point average, and have previously won a letter in a varsity sport that the MHSAA sponsors postseason competition.



Applicants will also be required to show involvement in other school-community activities and submit an essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Each MHSAA member school is allowed to nominate a number of student-athletes based on the size of the school. Class A schools can nominate six boys and six girls, Class B four boys and four girls, Class C three boys and three girls and Class D two boys and two girls. The first 30 scholarships will be awarded based on this graduated scale, with two additional scholarships intended for minority applicants.

A committee composed of school administrators from across the state will select regional and statewide winners.

Farm Bureau Insurance, a long-time supporter of MHSAA activities, also sponsors other educationally oriented programs.

The 32 scholarship recipients will be recognized at the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Student Events Center in East Lansing in March 2023.

The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

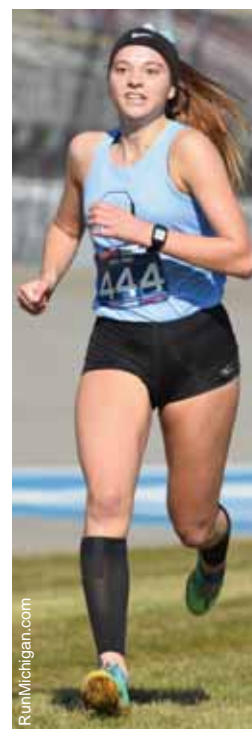
