Jones Gets No. 4 in a Breeze

Runners at Hunter Jones' level don't get racing advice from just anybody. In the days leading up to his bid for history at the 2022 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 3 Final, the Benzie Central senior chatted with the most legendary distance runner to compete at the Michigan high school level.

Jones' coach thought it would be a good idea for him to talk with former Rockford star Dathan Ritzenhein, a three-time Olympian whose time of 14:10.4 at Michigan International Speedway in 2000 has never been approached.

"I had a phone call with him a couple days ago," Jones said. "He just kind of coached me through what to do. It's pretty cool we have that connection. He just told me don't worry about time. His advice was just go out and red-line the whole time; go hard the whole time. I did that. My legs were pretty tired in the middle. I couldn't push as much as I wanted to."

Jones hoped to make a run at Ritzenhein's course record, but strong winds at MIS threw that pursuit out the window. He had to be satisfied with putting his name in the record books as the first boy to win the LP championship four times under the MHSAA Divisional format and breaking the Division 3 record of 14:52.8 set by Ovid-Elsie's Maverick Darling in 2007. He is the third runner to win four MHSAA Finals boys titles and second in Lower Peninsula history, following only Central Lake's Ryan Shay (Class D, 1993-96).

Jones' time of 14:46.50 surpasses the time of 14:49.62 by Hartland's Riley Hough in 2020 as the No. 2 performance all-time at MIS.

Jones comes from the same part of the state as Shay.

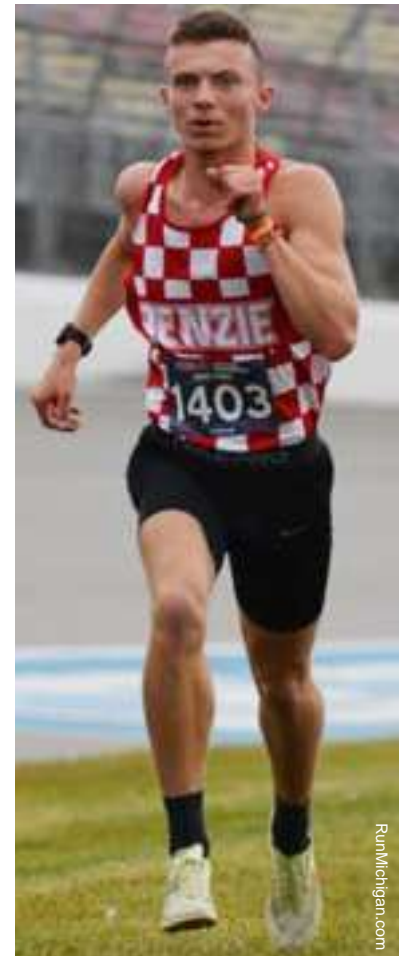
"To have that up-north connection with Ryan Shay, it's great because there's not a lot of people up there compared to a metro area like Detroit and Grand Rapids," Jones said.

Jones cleared the field by more than a minute. The race for second place was considerably more dramatic, as Clayton Ackey of Hart outleaned Parks Allen of Ithaca by three hundredths of a second with a time of 15:52.14.

Jones never lost to a Division 3 or 4 runner during his four seasons. He won 51 of 54 races during his career. His only career losses were to top Division 1 and 2 runners.

Hart won the team championship with 116 points, beating runner-up Traverse City St. Francis by 31. St. Louis was third with 161. The team title was Hart's first and came after the Pirates finished runners-up in 2020 and 2021.

Hart had three runners crack the top 12 overall and the top seven in the team race. Following Ackley were senior Wyatt Dean in eighth in 16:20.05, senior Seth Ackley in 12th in 16:27.51, senior Caleb Bitely in 44th in 17:17.71 and senior Easton Vander Zwaag in 116th in 17:58.80.



Osterink Repeats, Brings Team With Him

In 2022, it wasn't just about individual glory for Lezawe Osterink. As soon as Osterink crossed the finish line after winning his second MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 4 cross country championship, his thoughts turned to his Wyoming Potter's House Christian teammates who were still on the course.

He didn't have to wait long for his friends to join the post-race party.

Potter's House became the first boys team to sweep the first three places in an MHSAA Final since the meet moved to Michigan International Speedway in 1996. The Pumas' fourth and fifth runners weren't much farther back, giving Potter's House a Division 4-record score of 35 points.

"Last year, we weren't as good," Osterink said. "It was more of an individual focus. This year, it was more exciting. I love training with them."

Osterink dominated the field, winning by 24.01 seconds in 15:36.84. Although he was running solo up front, he was aware of what was taking place behind him.



MHSAA Finals

Senior Logan Swiney was second in 16:00.85, and junior Jackson Rodriguez was third in 16:07.23 to complete the Pumas' 1-2-3 sweep. Completing the team score were junior Ian Palacio, who was 11th overall and seventh in the team race in 16:42.91; and junior Noah Finton, who was 30th overall and 22nd in the team race in 17:18.00. All five scoring runners made all-state.

The Pumas' score is the third-lowest for a boys team at the MHSAA Lower Peninsula championships since 1956. The only lower scores both took place in 2006 when Pinckney won Division 1 with 27 points and Dexter won Division 2 with 28.

It was the first MHSAA cross country championship for the Pumas, who were 11th in 2020 and 12th in 2021. Potter's House hadn't qualified for the Finals before 2020.

Johannesburg-Lewiston finished second with 101 points, while Petoskey St. Michael was third with 153.

Division 1 Boys

Benne Anderson knew he had his hands full with Seth Norder, so he couldn't allow himself to worry about the strong wind the Grand Rapids-area rivals were running into for nearly 15 minutes.

"You kind of just have to ignore it, kind of just push," Anderson said. "Most of this sport is just mental. You've got to lock yourself in and go."

Anderson, a senior at Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills, and Norder, a junior at Grand Haven, were locked in a sprint to the finish that appeared to be taking place in slow motion because of the heavy winds.

It was Anderson who overcame the elements and the competition to win the 2022 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 1 championship with a time of 15:17.32. Norder was a close second in 15:18.95.

Northville, which has been a regular at the MHSAA Finals, won its first team championship by scoring 122 points. Traverse City Central was second with 196. Junior Brendan Herger was third in 15:34.05 to lead Northville.

Division 1 Girls

Helen Sachs (right) of Holland West Ottawa doesn't run alone in many cross country meets, which is unusual for an elite runner. The best runners have to learn to race solo, because there will be meets in which they can simply overwhelm the competition.

But there is always at least one worthy competitor when Sachs races. She runs on the same team as senior Arianne Olson, herself one of the top contenders at the 2022 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 1 Final.

So, Sachs was surprised to find herself already alone at the front just 200 meters into the race. She never allowed the pack to catch up, winning by 24.73 seconds with a time of 17:18.74.

Olson, who was third in 2021, placed ninth this time in 18:27.13. That powerful 1-2 punch up front allowed West Ottawa to win the team championship in dominant fashion, 97-172 over runner-up Romeo.

Division 2 Boys

The seeds that bore fruit in 2022 for Chelsea junior Connell Alford were planted five years earlier. After making his first trip to watch the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals as a 6th-grader, Alford began setting lofty goals for himself.

"In 2017, Chelsea won the team title," Alford said. "That was my first state meet. I thought, 'You know what, I want to be a state champion one day.' Since then, it's always been a goal."

Alford dominated the field in the Lower Peninsula Division 2 meet, posting a time of 15:12.61 to outpace runner-up Carter McCalister of Monroe Jefferson by 24.93 seconds.

East Grand Rapids won the meet with 132 points, edging Chelsea was by five points. The Pioneers didn't have a finisher until junior Ryan Brinker crossed in 28th place in 16:19.01, but he soon had company. Junior Alex Thole was 33rd (16:28.79), senior Elijah Robinson was 36th (16:30.52), freshman Jonah Workman was 45th (16:38.09) and junior Davis Christy was 46th (16:40.83).

Division 2 Girls

How strong of a cross country conference is the Ottawa-Kent Conference White? So good that Drew Muller of East Grand Rapids didn't even win the two conference jamborees she raced in 2022.

Yet, she was first when it mattered the most, winning the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 2 championship.

Muller crossed the finish line in 18:18.47 to win by 9.36 seconds over Otsego freshman Emma Hoffman.

"It's been like this a lot during the season," Muller said. "All the teams we race against in our conference are so stacked. Everyone who runs there is so amazing, so it makes it fun."

Muller became an MHSAA champion after finishing fifth in Division 2 both of the previous two years.

The only title that eluded Muller was the team championship, something East Grand Rapids captured in three of the prior four seasons.

Instead, it was Otsego that returned to the top for the first time since winning back-to-back championships in 2015 and 2016. Otsego put four runners in the top 14. Freshman Emma Hoffman was second in 18:27.83, junior Logan Brazee was seventh in 18:42.95, junior Megan Germain was eighth in 18:47.56 and sophomore Taylor Mitchell was 14th in 18:57.08.

Division 3 Girls

Cross country races can be won between the ears before runners ever step foot onto the course. Attitudes were tested as rain began and the wind picked up just before the start of the 2022 Lower Peninsula Division 3 girls race.

Hart sophomore Jessica Jazwinski was leaving life as she prepared to race.

"As a distance runner, I really try to love the wind," she said. "Distance running and cross country is just a tough sport. The wind just adds to it — and the rain, too. It's super fun."

Jazwinski overcame the elements to run the fifth-fastest Division 3 time ever, winning with a time of 17:36.70. She has two of the top-five times in Division 3 Finals history, having run 17:31.4 to place third in 2021.

Traverse City St. Francis emerged from a close battle to win its first team title since 2016 with 134 points. Pewamo-Westphalia was second with 142 and Lansing Catholic third with 165.

Sophomore Betsy Skendzel led St. Francis, placing seventh in 18:48.33.

Division 4 Girls

People in Aiden Harrand's (right) support system saw potential in her before she saw it in herself. She was having a strong start to her freshman year at Buckley in 2020, but Harrand had no idea how good she could become.

"My freshman year, I had all the people around me kind of saying, 'You could win the state meet your freshman year,'" Harrand said. "I didn't really believe it."

It took two years, but Harrand has fulfilled the promise that her coaches and teammates forecasted for her. She won the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 4 championship last fall with a time of 19:05.89.

Harrand was a contender her first two years, placing fifth and second.

Johannesburg-Lewiston won its first team championship, scoring 118 points to beat 2021's program-best sixth-place finish. Hillsdale Academy was second with 151 and Whitmore Lake was third with 192.

Sophomore Allie Nowak was third in 19:20.80, freshman Yolanda Gascho was seventh in 20:04.18, junior Madalyn Agren was 49th in 21:17.05, senior Adelaida Gascho was 54th in 21:26.87 and junior Rosalinda Gascho was 58th in 21:32.23 for Johannesburg-Lewiston.

Michigan International Speedway

Michigan International Speedway is the site for the 2023 Michigan High School Athletic Association Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals — the 28th time the Finals for all classes, both boys and girls, will be held on the same course on the same day.

Michigan International Speedway opened in 1968. Over 2.5 million tons of earth was moved to construct the two-mile oval and two, 1.9-mile road courses. The road courses wind through the infield and behind the backstretch, parts of which form the route the runners will follow today. Runners could see a variety of wildlife while winding through the hilly terrain behind the backstretch, including many deer which live on the property. MIS is home to one of Michigan's largest paid-admission sporting events each year. Fans also enjoy NASCAR and ARCA Menard Series events during race weekends in June and August.

Michigan International Speedway has provided the use of this unique, 1,400-acre facility, as well as many of its services to the MHSAA for this meet at a discounted rate. The MHSAA hopes you enjoy your visit to the beautiful Irish Hills.

Spectator Viewing

Spectators may view today's races from the main grandstands, on pit road or from designated course locations. To access the infield/pit road area use the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel located south of the main grandstands in turn 1. Please note that access to the finish area, garage area and infield suites are restricted to the athletes, coaches and officials.

Handicap Sections

Handicapped/wheelchair access is located in the main grandstands. Handicapped/wheelchair access is also available in Victory Lane near the finish area. Paved handicap parking is available in Lot 11, which is located across the street from the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel entrance.

First Aid

Medical assistance is available through Jackson Community Ambulance services.

Restrooms

Public facilities are available under the main grandstands. Facilities are also available on the infield.

Concessions & Finals Merchandise

Refreshments and food can be purchased in the concession area behind the south end of the main grandstands and in two locations near the infield awards area. Souvenir t-shirts, sweatshirts, souvenir programs and photographs will be sold at infield locations near the start line and awards area.

Spectator videotaping and still photography are allowed at the Cross Country Finals with the understanding that the tape or images are for personal use only and not to be sold, leased, borrowed, rented or duplicated for commercial purposes or shown on television or the Internet. Videotaping and still photography must be done in a manner that does not obstruct the view of other spectators.

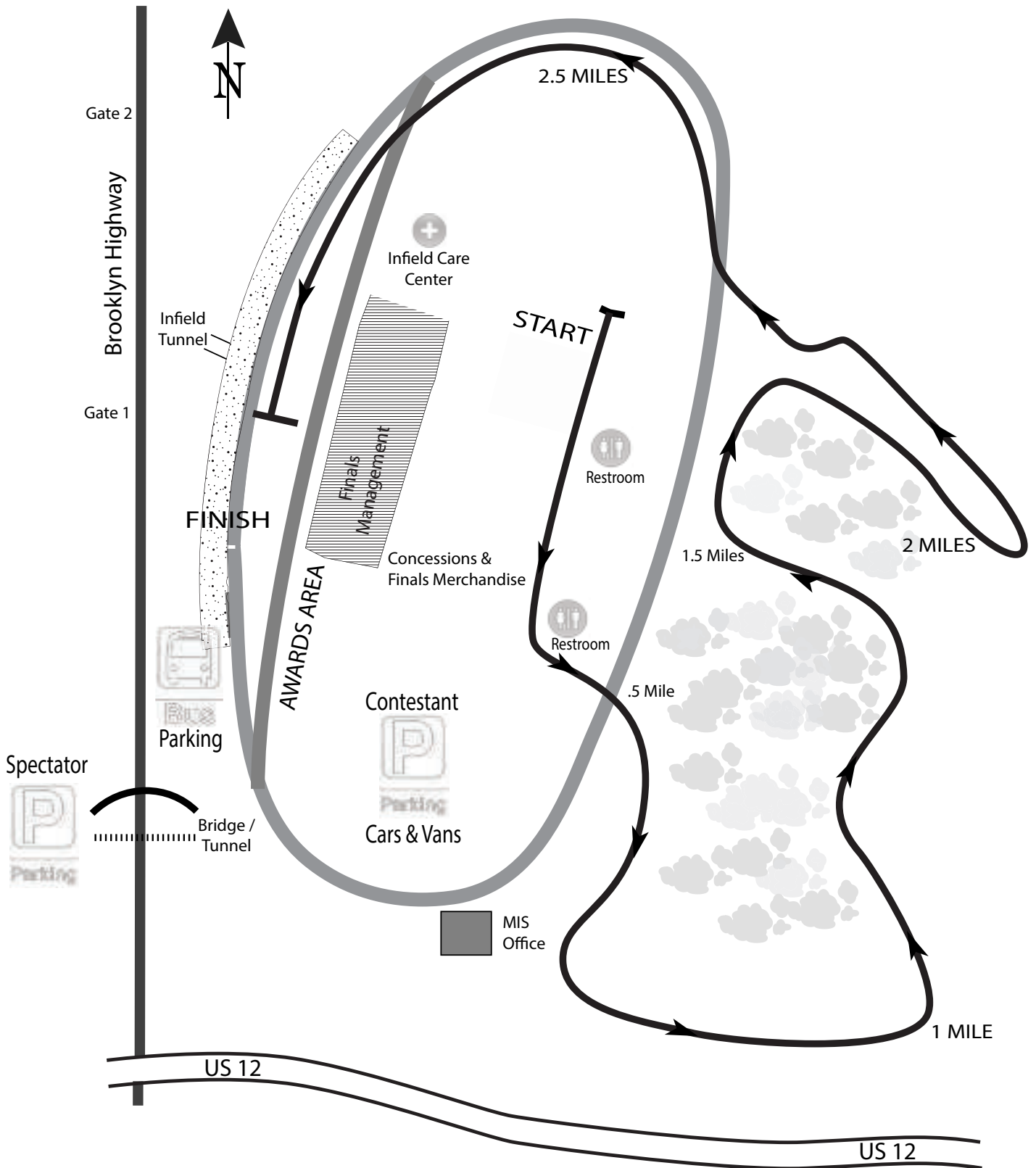
Participating Team/Spectator Internet Streaming

School Activity Important for Middle Schools

The positive life lessons learned through education-based athletics and performing arts within our nation's high schools have been documented time and time again: Teamwork . . . Fair Play . . . Self-Discipline . . . Self-Confidence . . . Hard Work.

Studies have also shown that students involved in school-based activity programs have better attendance records and lower dropout rates than students not involved in sports and performing arts. And the necessity of these programs became even more apparent when many schools were forced to implement virtual learning during the pandemic.

The message that has not been shared as frequently is that these same activity programs – sports, music, speech, debate, theater and other activities – are just as crucial to be in place in our nation's junior high schools and middle schools. In addition to the 19,500-plus high schools in the United States, it is estimated that there are another 15,000 middle schools and junior high schools.

Unfortunately, the infrastructure for sports and arts programs at the middle school level is not as organized as it is in grades 9-12. And before kids move from elementary to middle school and opt for non-school sports exclusively in order to play and travel more, efforts should be made by school districts to provide funds and personnel to establish education-based activities in middle schools that are aligned with high school programs.

And the need today is perhaps greater than ever to have these opportunities in place at the middle school level as students leave elementary school and begin the process of becoming teenagers and then adults. Sports and arts programs, along with teacher-coaches who develop and lead these activities, can be stable and positive influences for students at this crucial stage in life.

In the process of developing activity programs in middle schools, alignment with their high school's sports and performing arts programs is important. In the May 2023 issue of *High School Today*, Rhonda Farney, the nation's winningest high school girls basketball coach in the country from Georgetown, Texas, shared a few strategies for aligning a district's middle school and high school programs.

"A successful sports program from middle school through high school requires a cohesive approach that focuses on skill development, teamwork and the creation of a positive culture," Farney said. "The program must be sustainable, requiring the buy-in of multiple people. By creating a program that is integrated, sustainable and successful, students can develop their physical abilities and social skills, and achieve their full potential."

About one-half of the NFHS member state associations offer some level of services for middle school programs, and the NFHS continues to provide more resources for state associations and schools.

The NFHS Middle School Committee, chaired by Bill Faflick, executive director of the Kansas State High School Activities Association, was started a couple of years ago and meets annually. In April, the NFHS launched "Middle School Coaching" as an online course on the NFHS Learning Center: NFHSLearn.com.

"Middle School Coaching" is designed as a counterpart to "Fundamentals of Coaching" – the flagship course for high school coaches that was first course ever launched through the Learning Center in 2007. Coaches focused on the true mission of education-based school activities is even more crucial at the middle school level, and this course helps individuals balance the numerous factors in running an efficient middle school activities program.

While much of the messaging the past few years has focused on the need for more officials in middle school and high school sports, that need for human resources extends to coaches as well – coaches who are committed to developing "task-involved" students rather than those who are "ego-involved."

Another tool to help schools initiate middle school activities is the NFHS Middle School Newsletter, which was launched last April and conveys our hope for developing life-changing programs in middle schools nationwide:

"The NFHS believes that an understanding of the unique physical, psychological, emotional and developmental needs of all middle-level age student participants should drive all aspects of middle-level interscholastic activities. We believe middle-level education-based activity programs exist to connect students to the fabric and culture of the school which leads to academic and lifelong success."

The first issue contains tools for dealing with unsportsmanlike behavior, resources for Unified Sports tools at the middle school level, videos to share at parents meetings and resources for Performing Arts at the middle level.

Students in middle schools are entering a challenging time in life and they need positive outlets such as sports and performing arts in an educational setting. We encourage more school districts to allocate the necessary funds to make these programs available.

Scholar-Athlete Award in 35th Year Awarding Scholarships to Students

Thousands of students voluntarily extend their classroom day by taking part in extracurricular activities, often improving their academic achievements in the process. The value that such programs play in the total education of a high school student is highlighted through the MHSAA/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award, which will award \$2,000 scholarships to 32 top student-athletes and recognize over 2,000 other outstanding individuals in 2023-24.

Underwritten by Farm Bureau Insurance, the Scholar-Athlete Award is now in its 35th year, and presents scholarships to students in every MHSAA enrollment classification. The scholarships may be used at any institution of higher learning.

“It is amazing to see the number of young people who are proven achievers in academics and activities,” said Mark Uyl, executive director of the MHSAA. “At a time when our educational system is coming under fire, the Scholar-Athlete

Award is something that proves how important athletics are to the development of a well-rounded person.”

Students applying for the Scholar-Athlete Award must be graduating during the 2023-24 school year, carry a 3.5 grade-point average, and have previously won a letter in a varsity sport that the MHSAA sponsors postseason competition.



Applicants will also be required to show involvement in other school/community activities and submit an essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Each MHSAA member school is allowed to nominate a number of student-athletes based on the size of the school. Class A schools can nominate six boys and six girls, Class B four boys and four girls, Class C three boys and three girls and Class D two boys and two girls. The first 30 scholarships will be awarded based on this graduated scale, with two additional scholarships intended for minority applicants.

A committee composed of school administrators from across the state will select regional and statewide winners.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2023-24 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2023-24 are: **Cale Bell**, Sault Ste. Marie; **Drew Cady**, Oxford; **Macy Jenkins**, Milford; **Isaiah Kabban**, Harbor Beach; **Ella Knudsen**, Leland; **Kaylee Kranz**, Clinton; **Joey Spada**, Kalamazoo Central; and **Anna Zoet**, Grandville Calvin Christian.

Those eight new members were selected from 105 applicants. That number of applicants was the fourth-most ever, with the last four years featuring the four highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class, members will have represented 137 schools from 50 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 16 MHSAA sports, and all eight will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

This school year, the Council will hand out championship trophies at Finals events, deliver a message about sports-

The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

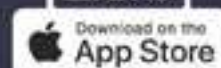

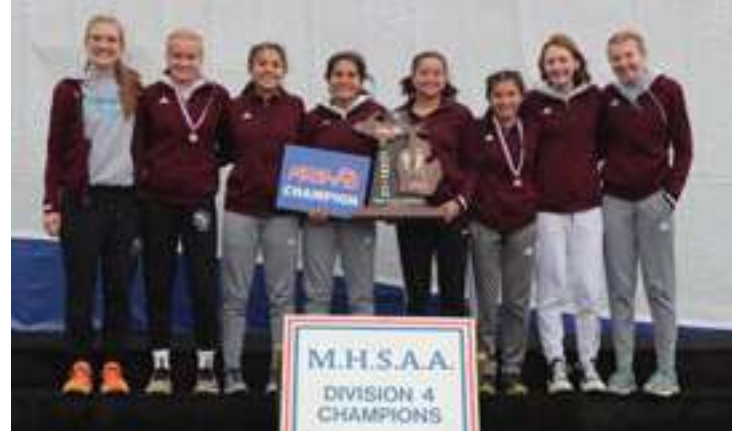
