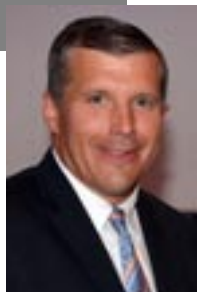

Forsyth Closes Legendary Run

Dathan Ritzenheim's time of 14:10.4 at the 2000 MHSAA Cross Country Finals has become the stuff of legend. During the 23 years that followed, no other runners has come remotely close to breaking the record set by the three-time Olympian from Rockford.

Years from now, perhaps **Rachel Forsyth's** (right) performance in 2023 at Michigan International Speedway will be just as revered.

She not only set the girls course record, she obliterated it.

Running solo from the gun, Forsyth ran a scorching 16:28.5 to shatter the course mark of Lansing Catholic's Olivia Theis in the 2017 Division 2 race.

It's worth noting that some of the greatest high school cross country runners in the country have graced MIS since the MHSAA moved its Finals there in 1996.

Megan Goethals of Rochester (2009) and Zofia Dudek of Ann Arbor Pioneer (2019) won Foot Locker national championships. Others have gone on to become college All-Americans.

It wasn't even Forsyth's fastest time this season. She ran 16:07.5 to win her Regional meet. Forsyth was more fixated on beating that time than taking down the course record.

"I just handled it like a normal race," Forsyth said. "My friends and I goofed off. We got ready as we normally did. No one put too much pressure on it."

It was the second MHSAA championship for Forsyth, the other coming as a sophomore when she ran 17:09.32.

After that, she began to struggle with an eating disorder which put her life in jeopardy. She was hospitalized at the University of Michigan's Mott Children's Hospital and was then admitted to the Eating Recovery Center in Illinois.

She was finally healthy enough to rejoin her team on the race course in late September 2022, but had lost much of her spectacular fitness. She finished 62nd.

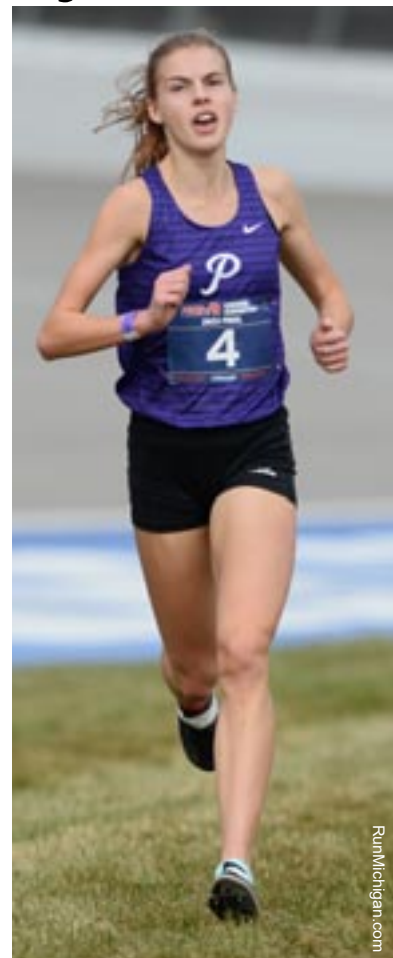
"It's very surreal, because I missed so much," Forsyth said. "So, to be able to be at my best ... is very special."

Forsyth said the process of making healthy decisions is still difficult, "but the benefits of doing what I have to pay off 100 percent."

Forsyth hoped to cap her record-breaking day with a team championship celebration, but Romeo had something to say about that, putting up a winning total of 65 points to claim its first Finals championship after finishing runner-up a year earlier. Pioneer was second this time with 126 points.

Freshman Annie Hrabovsky of Romeo established herself as a future championship contender, placing fourth in 17:28.7. Sophomore Natalia Guaresimo was seventh, sophomore Emerson Clor 13th, junior Lillian Deskins 22nd and junior Olivia Purdy 41st for Romeo.

The Bulldogs had four runners cross before Pioneer had two.



Freeland's Hansen Eclipses Long-Standing Mark

Freeland junior **TJ Hansen** (right) eclipsed the MHSAA LP Division 2 record with his winning time of 14:52.8 last November, bettering Richland Gull Lake's Kurtis Marlowe, who posted a 15:02.5 in 2000.

Runner-up Solomon Kwartowitz of Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook Kingswood also nearly broke the previous record, finishing in 15:03.3.

Even though it was apparent from earlier races that perfect conditions made fast times possible, Hansen didn't set out to break Marlowe's record.

"No, my goal was to go out and win," he said. "Play strategy from the front, let others do the work, then just push it. Whatever time I got, I was gonna get. I knew it was going to take a time like that to win it."

Hansen went through the mile mark tied for 11th in 4:54.3, but you could've thrown a blanket over the top 12 runners at that point.

It was a three-man race between Hansen, Kwartowitz and 2022 champion Connell Alford of Chelsea when they reached the two-mile mark in 9:46.



Hansen made sure there would be no drama coming down the stretch.

"I was just trying to stay calm, let them do the work, just sit back," he said. "When I needed to go, I was gonna go. My goal was to stay relaxed."

Kwartowitz had no complaints with his race.

"It felt really smooth," he said. "It was great. I didn't get a chance to race these guys a bunch this year. I was really hoping to end it with a victory."

The boys Division 2 team championship was a toss-up between four teams for the second year in a row, with Forest Hills Eastern coming out on top with 134 points. Pinckney was second with 156, East Grand Rapids third with 175 and Allendale fourth with 176.

In 2022, 32 points separated the top four teams.

Junior Henry Dixon led Forest Hills Eastern, placing sixth in 15:16.0. Senior Liam Hinman was 29th, senior Brendan Hoving was 30th, senior Cooper Jacobsen was 38th and junior Tyler Endres was 82nd.

Division 1 Boys

All that stood between Grand Haven's Seth Norder and his cross country dreams in 2022 were 1.63 lousy seconds. That was the margin when Norder took second place in the Division 1 Final to then-senior Benne Anderson of Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills.

Looking back, Norder believed his mistake was allowing that race to come down to a sprint to the finish line. He wasn't about to make the same mistake twice.

When Norder looked over his shoulder down the stretch, he didn't see a serious threat as he put the finishing touches on an individual Division 1 championship last November in 14:54.3.

"Last year, I lost on a sprint-off with like 200 (meters) to go," Norder said. "I wasn't going to let that happen again."

Norder finally has a championship on his resume' after placing second twice.

The team championship went to Northville its second straight, scoring 128 points to edge Brighton by 13.

Northville had three all-staters, with senior Brendan Herger placing third in 15:05.6, junior Ethan Powell 13th in 15:28.0 and sophomore Benjamin Hartigan 24th in 15:37.7.

Division 2 Girls

Emily Tomes (right) of Grand Rapids Catholic Central might be the first MHSAA cross country champion to go all season without winning a meet until it mattered the most.

She had five second-place finishes in nine races and didn't run faster than 18:25.5 until her conference and Regional meets.

"I ramped up my miles, so my legs felt tired for a lot of my races," Tomes said. "So, that's why I recently started running sub-18. My legs started to get used to the mileage. I was just trying to wait until this meet. This is when I was going to try to run my best."

It worked. Tomes was the Division 2 champion, running a time of 17:31.4. She won a kick down the stretch against St. Joseph senior Gail Vaikutis, who took second in 17:33.6.

Grand Rapids Christian won the team championship with a score of 112 points. 2022 champion Otsego was second with 131. The Eagles won their seventh MHSAA championship and first since 2014.

Senior Natalie VanOtteren, who defeated Tomes by 17 seconds at Regionals, led Grand Rapids Christian by placing fifth in 17:58.2.

Division 3 Boys

Pewamo-Westphalia senior Collin Farmer turned the lowest moment of his cross country career into motivation to be great. In 2022, Farmer was running with the pack of runners who were battling for second place behind four-time Division 3 champion Hunter Jones of Benzie Central.

Everything unraveled for Farmer around the time runners began to enter the track area at Michigan International Speedway. He faded from sixth place at the two-mile mark to 26th place at the end.

"I ended up dying at the end of the race last year," he said. "I took ownership of it and really wanted to push myself in the offseason."

All that work paid off with a first-place finish in Division 3, as Farmer crossed the line in 15:39.1 to finish his high school season with five consecutive victories.

The only disappointment for Farmer this time around was that his Pewamo-Westphalia team finished in seventh place.

A Traverse City St. Francis team that had been building its way toward the top won the team championship with 113 points. St. Louis was second with 175. St. Francis had finished in the top six each of the last four years, including runner-up in 2022.

Junior Leo Swager was 12th, junior Owen Read 33rd, junior Lewis Walter 35th, senior Tucker Krumm 37th and junior Riley Pattinson 44th for St. Francis.



Division 3 Girls

Hart junior Jessica Jazwinski has been so dominant in cross country that she needs to mentally conjure up competition to keep pushing herself.

"I try to think there's a girl right behind me," she said. "So, I'm always practicing, 'OK, there's a girl right behind me. If I don't push myself as hard as I can, she's going to beat me.'"

That mental game pushed Jazwinski to a record-breaking performance at the 2023 Finals. Her time of 17:08.8 broke the Division 3 record of 17:12.5 set by Abby Vanderkooi of Muskegon Western Michigan Christian in 2020.

She won by a whopping 40.7 seconds ahead of Jackson Lumen Christi senior Madison Osterberg, whose 17:49.5 performance was the 11th-fastest ever by a Division 3 girl.

After placing third as a freshman, Jazwinski has won the last two Division 3 championships.

Osterberg helped Lumen Christi to its 10th Finals championship and first since 2012. The Titans scored 140 points to defeat Traverse City St. Francis by 37.

Freshman Samantha Schroeder was 13th, sophomore Macy Fazekas was 43rd, senior Sydney Fazekas was 50th and junior Layla Lopez was 82nd for Lumen Christi.

Division 4 Boys

Marine City Cardinal Mooney senior **Tyler Lenn** (right) wasn't smiling much during the summer, after dealing with a stress fracture, Achilles' tendinitis and calf strains in both legs.

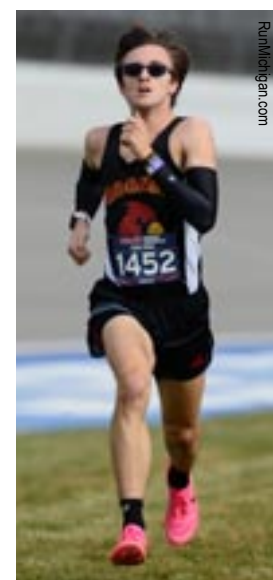
"Mentally, for me, it was not where I wanted to be," Lenn said. "I don't think anybody would want to be in that position."

But, Lenn was all smiles last November, standing atop the podium after winning the Division 4 individual championship with a personal-best time of 15:49.0 to win by 12 seconds over Owen Patton of Vestaburg.

Patton held a slight lead at the mile and two mile before Lenn laid down the hammer in the final mile.

Hillsdale Academy won the team championship, scoring 129 points to win by 70 ahead of Holland Calvary. It was the second MHSAA championship for Hillsdale Academy, which won in 2021.

Senior Thomas Holm was fourth, junior Reece Poole was fifth, sophomore Grayson Rorick was 20th, freshman Ryan Miller was 76th and sophomore Harry Lindsley was 80th for Hillsdale Academy.



Division 4 Girls

Buckley senior Aiden Harrand parlayed her MIS racing experience and veteran savvy into a second straight individual championship in 2023, as well as a Division 4 course record.

Harrand and Whitmore Lake freshman Kaylie Livingston ran together most of the race before Harrand pulled away slightly down the stretch to win in 17:38.9. Livingston was second in 17:44.7, also eclipsing the previous Division 4 mark set by four-time champion Kirsten Olling of Breckenridge in 2013.

"It was a little nerve-racking, because she's a good athlete, but I have — I don't want to say seniority — but I've been here longer. I have experience being here," Harrand said.

It was the fourth top-five finish for Harrand, who was fifth in 2020 and second in 2021 before winning her last two years.

Although the individual victory eluded Livingston, she got a championship as the top runner for a Whitmore Lake team that scored 78 points to win the team title by 34 points over Johannesburg-Lewiston.

The Trojans put five runners in the top 49, with sophomore Carina Burchi taking sixth, sophomore Sofia Robertson 20th, senior Natalie Meadows 30th and sophomore Elodie Weaver 49th.

Michigan International Speedway

Michigan International Speedway is the site for the 2023 Michigan High School Athletic Association Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals — the 29th time the Finals for all classes, both boys and girls, will be held on the same course on the same day.

Michigan International Speedway opened in 1968. Over 2.5 million tons of earth was moved to construct the two-mile oval and two, 1.9-mile road courses. The road courses wind through the infield and behind the backstretch, parts of which form the route the runners will follow today. Runners could see a variety of wildlife while winding through the hilly terrain behind the backstretch, including many deer which live on the property. MIS is home to one of Michigan's largest paid-admission sporting events each year. Fans also enjoy NASCAR and ARCA Menard Series events during race weekends in June and August.

Michigan International Speedway has provided the use of this unique, 1,400-acre facility, as well as many of its services to the MHSAA for this meet at a discounted rate. The MHSAA hopes you enjoy your visit to the beautiful Irish Hills.

Spectator Viewing

Spectators may view today's races from the main grandstands, on pit road or from designated course locations. To access the infield/pit road area use the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel located south of the main grandstands in turn 1. Please note that access to the finish area, garage area and infield suites are restricted to the athletes, coaches and officials.

Handicap Sections

Handicapped/wheelchair access is located in the main grandstands. Handicapped/wheelchair access is also available in Victory Lane near the finish area. Paved handicap parking is available in Lot 11, which is located across the street from the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel entrance.

First Aid

Medical assistance is available through Jackson Community Ambulance services.

Restrooms

Public facilities are available under the main grandstands. Facilities are also available on the infield.

Please take any recovered articles to the packet pick up/results room.

Concessions & Finals Merchandise

Refreshments and food can be purchased in the concession area behind the south end of the main grandstands and in two locations near the infield awards area. Souvenir t-shirts, sweatshirts, souvenir programs and photographs will be sold at infield locations near the start line and awards area.

Spectator Videotaping & Still Photography

Spectator videotaping and still photography are allowed at the Cross Country Finals with the understanding that the tape or images are for personal use only and not to be sold, leased, borrowed, rented or duplicated for commercial purposes or shown on television or the Internet. Videotaping and still photography must be done in a manner that does not obstruct the view of other spectators.

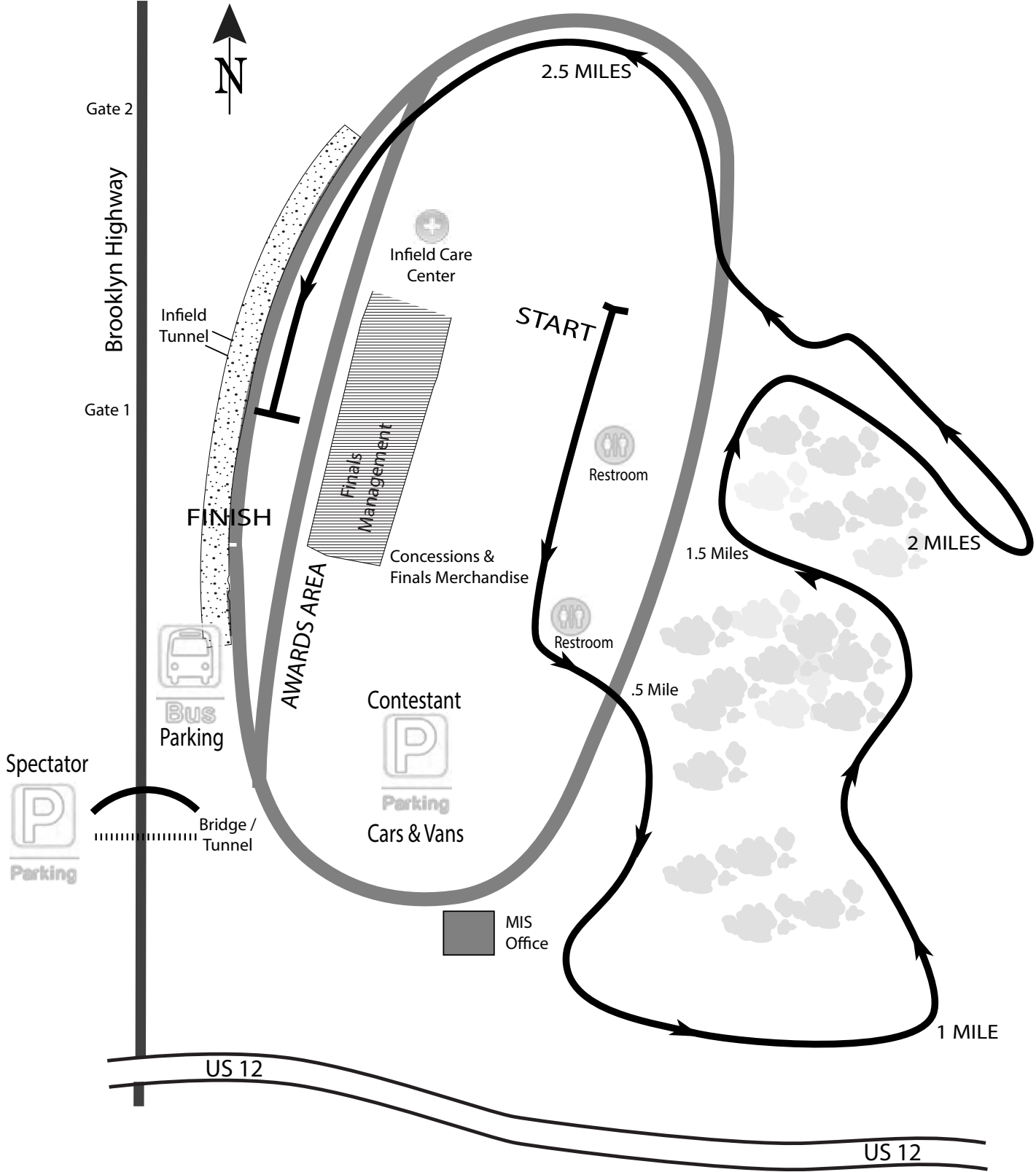
Participating Team/Spectator Internet Streaming

Sportsmanship Extends to Online Behavior

With the changes that have occurred in college sports the past couple of years, high school sports is truly the last level of pure amateur competition in our country – and the NFHS and its member state associations want it to remain that way.

As football, volleyball, soccer, cross country and other sports begin this fall, high school coaches and athletic/activity directors will be involved in preseason meetings to emphasize the expected outcomes of education-based sports, as well as speech, debate, music, theatre and other programs.

Among those fundamental values of education-based activities that must be discussed is sportsmanship, or good sporting behavior. More than winning, more than learning the skills of a sport, a focus on sportsmanship has been one of the defining elements of high school sports and other activities for more than 100 years.

Along with maintaining the sound traditions of sports and minimizing the risk of injury, NFHS playing rules encourage sportsmanship, and the first page in all NFHS rules publications includes a statement noting that “each athlete is responsible for exercising caution and good sportsmanship.”

In the past, with an emphasis on conduct on the playing field or court – or in the auditorium or rehearsal hall – sportsmanship has been defined as those qualities of behavior that are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. More so than preparing students to play sports or another activity at the next level, one of the significant goals of education-based high school sports and activities is helping the 12 million-plus individuals in these programs to become responsible citizens.

And in today’s online world dominated by hand-held devices, that goal has become more challenging. Now, messages to students in high school sports and other activities about sportsmanship must be communicated before they hit the practice field or court because one inappropriate post, tweet or message could alter their lives forever.

At the recent virtual National Student Leadership Summit hosted by the NFHS, Christina Jontra of Neptune Navigate, one of the newest NFHS corporate partners, discussed the need for good sportsmanship online as much or more so than on the court or field.

In the digital age in which we live, participants in high school activity programs need to be aware that their character and respect for others should be the same, whether in the sport or activity itself, or online.

As the popularity and influence of social media continues to surge, it is imperative that student-athletes, as well as coaches, administrators, parents and everyone involved in education-based athletics, are aware of the ways they can endanger themselves with their online behavior and understand the techniques they can employ to prevent that from happening.

In her recent presentation, Jontra noted five characteristics of good sportsmanship online – honesty, compassion, respect, responsibility and courage. Just as a student would respect an opponent on the field or in the debate room, the same must occur online.

At preseason meetings this fall, coaches and athletic/activity directors should encourage students in their programs to be mindful of online contact with individuals on opposing teams – particularly any bantering that could be perceived as cyberbullying. As Jontra mentioned in her message during the NSLS, hurtful words can ruin a person’s life forever.

Fortunately, during the season, the millions of high school students involved in sports and performing arts have less free time to spend online on a daily basis, but the time spent must be done in a positive manner. Not only could damaging words on social media affect a student’s chances for an athletic scholarship, inappropriate messages could also negatively impact future job possibilities as employers are more actively auditing social media.

Whether the setting is before hundreds of people at an actual game or event, or a private experience alone online, positive and respectful behavior should be the choice every time.

Scholar-Athlete Award in 36th Year Awarding Scholarships to Students

Thousands of students voluntarily extend their classroom day by taking part in extracurricular activities, often improving their academic achievements in the process. The value that such programs play in the total education of a high school student is highlighted through the MHSAA/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award, which will award \$2,000 scholarships to 32 top student-athletes and recognize over 2,000 other outstanding individuals in 2024-25.

Underwritten by Farm Bureau Insurance, the Scholar-Athlete Award is now in its 36th year, and presents scholarships to students in every MHSAA enrollment classification. The scholarships may be used at any institution of higher learning.

“It is amazing to see the number of young people who are proven achievers in academics and activities,” said Mark Uyl, executive director of the MHSAA. “At a time when our educational system is coming under fire, the Scholar-Athlete Award is something that proves

how important athletics are to the development of a well-rounded person.”

Students applying for the Scholar-Athlete Award must be graduating during the 2024-25 school year, carry a 3.5 grade-point average, and have previously won a letter in a varsity sport that the MHSAA sponsors postseason competition.

Applicants will also be required to show involvement in other school/community activities and submit an essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Each MHSAA member school is allowed to nominate a number of student-athletes based on the size of the school. Class A schools can nominate six boys and six girls, Class B four boys and four girls, Class C three boys and three girls and Class D two boys and two girls. The first 30 scholarships will be awarded based on this graduated scale, with two additional scholarships intended

for minority applicants.

A committee composed of school administrators from across the state will select regional and statewide winners.

Farm Bureau Insurance, a long-time supporter of MHSAA activities, also sponsors other educationally oriented programs.

The 32 scholarship recipients will be recognized at the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Student Events Center in East Lansing in March 2025.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2024-25 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of MHSAA championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2024-25 are: **Itzel Albarran**, Bronson; **Harper Barnhart**, Brownstown Woodhaven; **Diamond Cook**, Southfield Christian; **Henry Ewles**, Pontiac Notre Dame Prep; **Cole Haist**, Big Rapids; **Frannie Keeley**, Jenison; **Trey LaValley**, Romeo; and **Ethan Stine**, Bridgman.

Those eight new members were selected from 90 applicants. The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 142 schools from 51 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 10 MHSAA sports, and five will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

This school year, the Council handed out championship trophies at Finals events, led sessions during four Sportsmanship Summits and provided assistance at the

MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

Behind The Scenes

The hallmark of a strong association is its ability to work together for the common good. Every year, nearly 8,000 game officials and 50,000-plus administrators and coaches at over 1,500 middle, junior and senior high schools voluntarily pool their efforts daily for the operations of the MHSAA's competitive extracurricular interscholastic athletic program.

Career Training

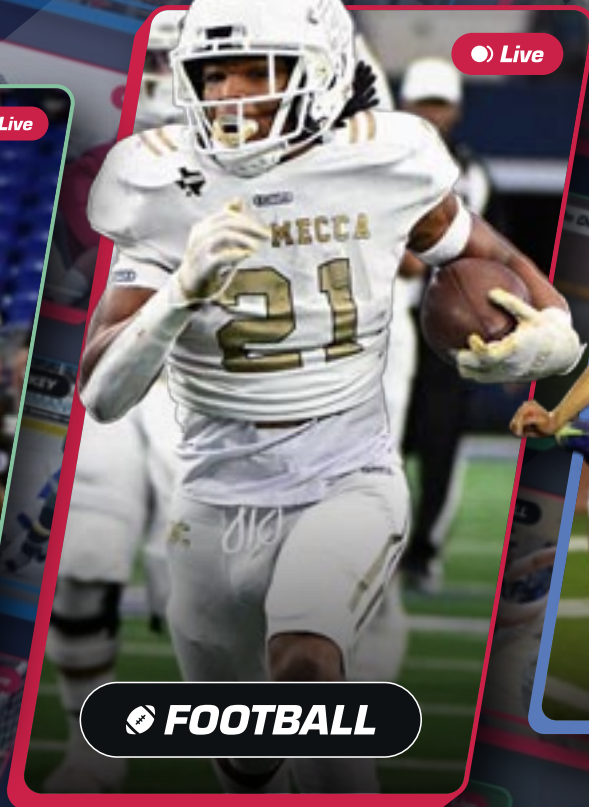
