

hen Collin Lemanski plays the way he did on the biggest of stages, his hockey coach is well within his rights to promote him to the fullest.

While identifying his players in a postgame press conference, Midland Dow coach Dick Blasy introduced the player seated to his left in full goaltending equipment as "best goalie in the state, Collin Lemanski."

Care to elaborate?

"You can't do this without goaltending," Blasy said after Dow won its first MHSAA hockey championship with a 2-0 victory over Orchard Lake St. Mary's in the 2022 Division 3 Final at USA Hockey Arena.

"How many shots did they have today? 32? How many goals did they get? I think that speaks for itself. Orchard Lake St. Mary's brought it. I don't think it takes a rocket hockey fan to know they took it to us more than we took it to them."


It was the seventh shutout of the season for Lemanski, who finished with an 18-3-3 record, a 1.29 goals against average and a .950 save percentage.

"I think it's less about the shutout and more about the team just winning it, our first win," Lemanski said. "It was great."

Lemanski said he didn't treat the championship game any differently than another game, going through his usual pregame routine

One of the staples of his pregame ritual is this: "Just don't talk to me." he said.

With Lemanski putting up an impenetrable barrier in front of the Dow net, the Chargers hung around throughout the game



until they got the break they needed.

Caden Chritz, who was robbed earlier in the period, broke to the net and took a shot that was stopped by Eaglets goalie Aidan Klingbeil. Nolan Sanders pounced on the rebound to score with 2:29 left in the third period.

"We knew we were gonna get our chances," Sanders said. "They had their chances. My line took it into the zone, put it on net, got it in front and just tapped it home."

With so little time on the clock, the Chargers couldn't get caught up in thinking they had just won the championship.

"We've got to keep our composure, got to stay simple until the final buzzer," Sanders said. "Just let things roll out."

Dow couldn't breathe easily until Ryan Pomranky banked a pool shot from his own end off the left boards and into an empty net with 17.7 seconds remaining.

Dow previously had reached the Semifinals three times without getting to the championship game, including in 2020 when COVID-19 shut down the Finals.

HARTLAND WINS OT THRILLER; DCC REPEATS

pair of perennial finalists returned to the championship podium in 2022, as Hartland took an overtime thriller in Division 2, and Detroit Catholic Central made it three straight in Division 1.

Hartland has won three championships and been runner-up twice over the past 10 seasons, the most recent being the 3-2 overtime win over Trenton.

Freshman Ian Kastamo was one of the young Hartland kids who watched the Eagles during their annual visits to USA Hockey Arena.

"I watched games my whole life," Kastamo said. "I've seen the big crowd, the energy, how fun it looks. This is my dream come true to play for this team, much less win the state championship."

Kastamo not only won a state championship, but he experienced one of the greatest moments in a hockey player's life by delivering it with an overtime goal. Kastamo scored 3:22 into overtime when he knocked in the rebound of a shot from the left point by Jorden Haydu.



The Eagles had to rebound mentally after allowing the game-tying goal by Trenton's Hayden Oboza with 1:32 left.

DCC, meanwhile, had a much easier finish in its 5-1 win over Brighton, but had to overcome a tense start.

Brighton opened the scoring on a goal by Cameron Duffany at 3:11 of the second period, but that only seemed to light a fire under the Shamrocks.

They stormed back, getting a goal from Parker Jamieson less than three minutes later. Brian Apple's goal at 11:52 of the second put the Shamrocks ahead, 2-1, entering the third period.

Catholic Central broke it open with goals by Jack Swamba at 2:11, Justin Hubenschmidt at 4:44 and Landon West at 12:11 to wrap up title No. 16.

DCC stuck with its goalie rotation of Nick Galda and Bobby Masters, with Galda between the pipes for the Final. In 2021 it was Masters' turn; last March Galda made the most of his shot with 17 saves in the victory.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2023

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 34 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2022-23 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2023-24 school year. This year, a total of 1,440 applications from 421 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Baksetball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.





Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

ight student-athletes who are now juniors at their schools have begun their two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2022-23 were: Kannon Duffing, Manchester; Claire Gorno, Gaylord; M'Khi Guy, Muskegon; Dawsen Lehew, Marcellus; Christian Sanders, Detroit Renaissance; Ben Sytsma, Grand Rapids Christian; Madeline Werner, Bay City All Saints; and DaNia Womack, Dearborn Advanced Tech Academy.

Those eight new members were selected from 115 applicants. That applicant total was the second-most ever, with the last three years featuring the three highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 129 schools from 48 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.



The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.


