





Extra Excitement

A Pair of Overtime Games Made for a Thrilling End to 2022

Ryan Skomial and the Brighton girls lacrosse program had experienced nothing but disappointment and heartbreak in their previous MHSAA Finals trips to Rockford over the last 10 years.

That changed in 2022. The Skomial-coached Bulldogs exhibited determination in an abrupt momentum swing early in the second half, which ultimately led to elation.



Brighton erased a six-goal deficit and captured the program's first MHSAA Division 1 girls lacrosse championship since 2011 with a 12-11 overtime victory over Grand Rapids Forest Hills Northern/Eastern at Carlson-Munger Stadium.

It was the Bulldogs' fourth straight Finals appearance at Rockford, with the 2020 season canceled because of the COVID-19 pandemic. They lost in Finals to Rockford in the Rams' home stadium in 2018, 2019 and 2021.

This time, Brighton senior Ella Boose's goal with 1:33 left in the first of two three-minute overtime periods proved the game winner. Sophomore goalkeeper Gabrielle Buckenberger helped make that tally stand.

In 2012, Skomial led Hartland to the Division 1 Final at Rockford, where her team lost to Birmingham United by the same 12-11 overtime score.

FHNE seemed bound and determined to capture the big tro-

phy in just its second season as a program. The BirdDogs held a 7-2 lead at halftime and extended it to 8-2 in the first minute of the second half.

The Bulldogs tallied seven of the next eight goals to knot the match at 9 with $10\frac{1}{2}$ minutes remaining.

It was anybody's game at that point.

FHNE senior Carly Wittlinger scored her third goal of the night with 2:06 left to put her team ahead 11-10, but Amanda Granader tied it with 1:39 remaining to set up the overtime.

Division 2 - East Grand Rapids 12, Detroit Country Day 11

As a player from East Grand Rapids' first girls lacrosse championship team in 2012, it means everything to Meggan Lloyd to uphold the Pioneers' rich tradition.

She's off to one heck of a start as the Pioneers' head coach. She's 1-for-1 in guiding her alma mater to Finals titles.

It wasn't easy, but East Grand Rapids got it done in the MHSAA Division 2 championship game with a 12-11 sudden victory in the third overtime against Detroit Country Day at Carlson-Munger Stadium.

Senior Lizzie Lundeen's goal 18 seconds into the third OT period secured the Pioneers' eighth Finals championship over the last 10 years, not counting the 2020 season which was canceled because of COVID-19.

Senior Eliana LaMange scored four goals for EGR. Soph Vivian LaMange had two goals and two assists for the East, which built a 6-3 halftime lead. Lundeen netted a hat trick. Senior Caroline Potteiger (right) made seven saves.

Sophomore Emma Arico tallied three goals and an assist to lead Country Day. Senior Ainsley Schilling had two goals and a pair of assists for the Yellowjackets, while freshman Mary Pavlou had two goals. Senior goalie Clara Yuhn made five saves.

Eagles Soar in OT Thriller

ith 12 minutes to play in the 2022 Division 1 Final, Hartland (19-4) could see the finish line with a two-goal lead against Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice, the dynasty in Division 1 lacrosse.

Though Rice rallied to tie the game at 10, Hartland became the first non-Detroit Catholic League team to earn the Division 1 title on **Bo Lockwood**'s (right) overtime goal to pull out a dramatic 11-10 victory at Howell Parker Middle School Stadium.

"I don't know if I'll go to sleep tonight," said Lockwood. "On my goal it was a great pick by Mac Tognetti. I got an opportunity, and I buried it."

Hartland (18-4) was attempting to avenge the 2021 Division 1 loss in the championship game. Rice had won 15 of the 16 title games played in Division 1, succumbing only to Catholic League rival Detroit Catholic Central 11-10 in 2018.

Rice (15-7) had won this spring's regular-season game against Hartland 15-11.

Now, it was Coach Nick Levanti's team's time to celebrate. Hartland dominated the offensive end for the first seven minutes and finally hit pay dirt when Lockwood scored to give the Eagles the first score. The lead didn't last long as Rice's Cashton Papadelis scored seconds later to tie the game, 1-1.

The see-saw game saw Hartland hold a 6-4 halftime advantage. The contest was then tied at 6, 7 and 8 before Drew Lockwood regained the advantage for Hartland with a goal with 2:38 left in the third. Brother Bo Lockwood followed suit 30 seconds later to give Hartland a two-goal lead.

Rice's Christian McNulty scored with a little more than eight minutes left to cut the Rice deficit to 10-9. With 3:55 left in regulation, Sam Klein scored his third goal to tie the game 10-10.

The next goal was Lockwood's overtime winner. Lockwood also finished with four assists.

Division 2 Forest Hills Central 11, Detroit Country Day 8

Both sides knew what to expect in the Division 2 Boys Lacrosse Final after having faced each other early in 2022.

Grand Rapids Forest Hills Central entered the rematch undefeated behind the sterling goaltending of Crandall Quinn.

Quinn (right) sparked the defense and Jonah McConnell's four goals paced the offense as the Rangers prevailed 11-8 over Detroit Country Day, after also winning the first matchup 18-10 in March.

Forest Hills Central secured its fifth Division 2 title, while the Yellowjackets were playing for a potential third.



Trailing throughout the first half, the Rangers took a 7-6 halftime lead as two stingy defenses kept the game close.

Country Day's Caden Daley tied the game at 7-7 with 6:24 to play in the third quarter. But Forest Hills Central regained the lead on Jake Koning's first goal of the game.



Nathan Sarjeant give the Rangers their largest lead of the game at 9-7 on a goal late in the third. DCD's Talon Garn made it a one-goal game with 8:46 to play, but Miles Duiven scored his second of the game moments later to make it 10-8.

McConnell scored his fourth goal of the game to give the eventual winners an 11-8 cushion with 5:08 to play

Country Day was held to two goals during the second half.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2023

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 34 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2022-23 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2023-24 school year. This year, a total of 1,440 applications from 421 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients were honored during the MHSAA Boys Baksetball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.



Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

ight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2023-24 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2023-24 are: Cale Bell, Sault Ste. Marie; Drew Cady, Oxford; Macy Jenkins, Milford; Isaiah Kabban, Harbor Beach; Ella Knudsen, Leland; Kaylee Kranz, Clinton; Joey Spada, Kalamazoo Central; and Aynalem Zoet, Grandville Calvin Christian.

Those eight new members were selected from 105 applicants. That number of applicants was the fourth-most ever, with the last four years featuring the four highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 137 schools from 50 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 16 MHSAA sports, and all eight will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.



The MHSAA Representative Council

he Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
