FANS

Spectator parking: Fans may park in Lot SC39 or the commuter lot for entry into the facility. There are two entrances into the U of M Lacrosse Stadium (see map).

Handicap Parking & Accessible Entrance: Again, handicap parking will be available in the Reserved/Handicap lot located just north of the U of M Lacrosse Stadium for all those with a state-issued handicap placard. Spectators who do not have state-issued handicap placards but still need accommodations may be dropped off in the circle at the north end of the stadium, where Event Staff will be there to assist.

The main entrance on the north end of the U of M Lacrosse Stadium is ADA-accessible. ADA-accessible platforms are located on either end of the grandstand. An elevator is located inside the Lacrosse Facility to assist anyone with appropriate credentials needing to get to the press box area.

Tickets: All tickets will be sold through GoFan for \$11. No cash – credit card payments only. There will be credit card readers at the gate for fans without cell phones. One ticket is good for both games of the double-header on that day, but there is no re-entry. Spectators who leave the facility will be required to purchase another ticket. Participating teams will be admitted at no charge for games before and after their game when teams enter the Team Gate together accompanied by the coaching staff.

Pass Liss: For those individuals on the PASS LIST submitted by the school's athletic directors, it will be at the north ticket gate, which is the stadium entrance nearest the tennis courts.

Designated Seating: All seating is GENERAL ADMISSION, with the notable exception of the sections reserved for competing school students. Fans are encouraged to sit behind their team's designated bench – the home team will be on the south bench nearest the track, and the away team will be on the north bench nearest the tennis courts

Concessions: There is a full-service concession stand located directly behind the U of M Lacrosse Stadium grandstand, just inside the South Athletic Campus Fan Zone.

First Aid: Huron Valley Ambulance will be on-site and available for assistance. Should any spectator require medical assistance, please see a U of M Lacrosse Stadium Event Team Member.

Fan Conduct: The MHSAA and University of Michigan Athletics are committed to providing a fun, respectful, and inclusive environment for all. Participants and guests should not be subjected to harassment, intimidation, or any other kind of disruptive behavior while attending events. Any fan who engages in disruptive behaviors - including but not limited to appearing inebriated; entering the field of play or throwing objects in the stands or onto the field; harassing or intimidating others; or directing profane, insulting, abusive, or highly critical language at another person (such as racist, sexist, homophobic, transphobic or demeaning slurs) - will be removed from the event and may face arrest and prosecution in accordance with local, state, and federal laws.

Any fan behavior that directly or indirectly interferes with others' enjoyment of the game or the conduct of the event will be promptly addressed and may result in the revocation of the ticket license and removal from the venue.

Prohibited Items & Spectator Policies: Student and adult spectators are expected to observe the rules of good sportsmanship and conduct. Some specific policies are as follows:

Prohibited items not allowed at U of M Lacrosse Stadium

- Outside food or beverage
- Alcoholic beverages
- Dogs and other pets (service animals for disabilites are allowed)
- Weapons
- Coolers
- Bottles
- Cans
- Flasks
- Irritants (i.e., noisemakers, air horns, etc.)
- Aerosol and Spray Cans
- Any projectile or object that could cause injury if thrown onto the playing surface or into the seating areas
- Tents

MHSAA Tournament Spectator Policies

- NO TAILGATING
- All spectators must wear shirts
- Cheers of encouragement should be in support of teams, not directed toward opposing teams/individuals.
- Abuse of officials will not be allowed
- Sunflower seeds are not permitted

Fan and postgame meeting area: After the game, parents and fans can meet their players on the concourse behind the grandstand. These team meeting locations will be designated by MHSAA flags: the home team on the south end of the stadium and the away team on the north end of the stadium.
