Saving the Best for Last

Grosse Pointe North girls soccer coach Olivia Dallaire sent a special thank you to her co-workers at Grosse Pointe Beaumont Hospital last June after her team claimed its first MHSAA Finals title at MSU's DeMartin Stadium.

"I played four years here on this field (at Michigan State) and four years as a player at Grosse Pointe North," Dallaire said. "I'm very speechless. I'm at a loss for words.

"I did have to go to work today," the nurse anesthetist added, "but my co-workers allowed me to work half a shift and covered for me."

The Norsemen earned a 3-2 edge in a shootout to clinch a 3-2 win over East Grand Rapids in the Division 2 championship game. After winning just one game in the Macomb Area Conference Red and entering the postseason with four victories total, the Norsemen capped their first championship run at 10-7-7 – proving it's good to get hot at the right time.

The winning kick in the shootout came from senior Mia Stephanoff. Goalkeeper Grace McCormick did the rest, stopping two shots by EGR with another flying over the goal.

"I always pick the same side because I practice it every day," said Stephanoff. "I know I'm good at it and I know I can make it, even when they guess right, which she did. When I saw her I said 'Oh God.'

North was down 2-0, but Dallaire changed the offense in the second half and McCormick was phenomenal in goal.

East Grand Rapids (18-3-3) twins Gracie and Reese Lynn are freshmen who scored the first two goals for the Pioneers.

GPN responded when freshman Meredith Dodenhoff scored off an assist from junior midfielder Amelia Streberger from just outside the box with 15:10 left in the first half to make it 2-1.

The Norsemen then tied the score with just under 15 minutes left in regulation when Alyssa Burney's corner kick was mishandled and bounced into the net for an own goal.

Neither team scored over 20 minutes over overtime. Gabby Miller followed an opening shootout miss by EGR by sending her shot into the net. Reese Lynn tied the shootout 1-1, and the Pioneers went up 2-1 on Toki Budelmann's make. But Streberger tied it at 2-2, and Stephanoff decided it on GPN's next kick thanks to the saves by McCormick.

"This means so much to me and my team," said McCormick. "This whole year we've been the underdog. We worked so hard. So many players have improved. It's been a really great season. We did the same thing against Marian. I loved that we didn't give up."

DIVISION 1: Rochester Hill Stoney Creek 2, Hudsonville 1

Rochester Hills Stoney Creek's MHSAA Division 1 girls soccer championship battle against Hudsonville was expected to be a low-scoring, high-energy battle.

It lived up to the billing – and for the Cougars, so much more.

Stoney Creek scored two goals over the final 8:41, both from Lilley Bosley, to claim the title with a 2-1 victory.

Bottled up for most of the game, Bosley bounced in a rebound with 1:49 left to stun the Eagles. It was her 52nd goal of the season.

Hudsonville (19-3-2) shadowed Bosley all afternoon, including with freshman Lauren Moylan – who was fantastic as a defender and playmaker.

On her winning goal, Bosley said: "We scored a lot of our goals on set pieces. We have really good corner takers. Ava Avripas and Kaeli Butcher are fantastic on the corners. They are very accurate. We knew we were going to get on the end of one of the corners to score."

The Cougars (26-1-1) had defeated top-ranked Rochester High, No. 12 Utica Eisenhower and No. 15 Saline during its run. Hudsonville advanced with wins over No. 2 Northville and No. 7 Portage Central, and hadn't given up a goal in the playoffs before Bosley's first in the Final.

DIVISION 3: Hudsonville Unity Christian 3, Grosse Ile 0

Dynasty. Hudsonville Unity Christian has been to the Division 3 Girls Soccer Finals 15 times and reached at least the Semifinals 19 seasons.

The 2023 3-0 championship win over Grosse Ile – which was making its first Finals appearance – was the 11th for legendary coach Randy Heethuis, who also finished his 34th season with 620 victories.

During this playoff run the Crusaders outscored their six opponents by a combined 35-0. For the season, the Unity Christian defense allowed just eight goals, and never more than one in a game.

Unity Christian dominated play in the early going, but Cailey O'Farrell was great in goal for Grosse Ile, keeping the Crusaders off the scoreboard nearly the entire first half. Her 11 saves for the game made the MHSAA record book list for the most in a Final.

Unity finally broke through with 2:54 left in the first half on junior forward Stella DeSmit's goal off an assist from Emily Timmer. The Crusaders made it 2-0 when Brianna Rose, a senior, headed in a corner kick at the 30:13 mark.

Senior forward Jenna Schreiber scored at the 24:42 mark off an assist from DeSmit to give Unity a commanding 3-0 lead.

The Crusaders finished 21-1-2; Grosse Ile ended at 17-3-4.

DIVISION 4: Kalamazoo Christian 5, Clark Everest Collegiate 0

Senior forward Taylor Leonard finished her high school career with 106 goals, scoring what surely were three of her most memorable in the 2023 MHSAA Final.

Leonard also had an assist as Kalamazoo Christian downed Clarkston Everest Collegiate 5-0 in the Division 4 Final. The Comets (19-6) finished runner-up in 2022 and four of the last five seasons.

"It was such an amazing feeling; we've been working for this all season," said Leonard. "We've gone through a lot, and to come out with the win was amazing."

The Comets wasted no time getting on the board as Leonard blasted a shot just 2:12 into the game for a 1-0 lead.

Junior forward Sophia Nash scored the Comets' second goal on an assist from Leonard with 21:37 left in the first half to make it 2-0.

Less than a minute later, sophomore defender Jordyn Bonnema – a golf and basketball all-stater – blasted in a loose ball after a corner kick to make it 3-0. Leonard tacked on her second goal 2:30 later to make it 4-0.

She added her third goal 2:38 into the second half to make it 5-0.

Kalamazoo Christian came to the Finals with a rich championship history, having won Division 4 in 2003, 2004, 2007 and 2008.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2024

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 35 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2023-24 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2024-25 school year. This year, a total of 1,607 applications from 445 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.

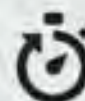

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2024-25 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of MHSAA championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2024-25 are: **Itzel Albarran**, Bronson; **Harper Barnhart**, Brownstown Woodhaven; **Diamond Cook**, Southfield Christian; **Henry Ewles**, Pontiac Notre Dame Prep; **Cole Haist**, Big Rapids; **Frannie Keeley**, Jenison; **Trey LaValley**, Romeo; and **Ethan Stine**, Bridgman.

Those eight new members were selected from 90 applicants. The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 142 schools from 51 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 10 MHSAA sports, and five will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition)

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
